

AMERICAN SETTLERS SAFE FROM YAQUI

Concentrated at Railroad Station to Be Taken to Mexican Coast.

INDIANS IN CONTROL OF THE ENTIRE VALLEY

Property Damage Is Feared—Permanent Garrison Needed to Keep Peace.

That the sixty-five American settlers in the Yaqui valley, Mexico, for whom grave fear has been entertained on account of the Yaqui Indian massacre, have been concentrated at Yaqui Pueblo, on the railway within reach of the coast, was the reassuring news given out by the State Department. But this is qualified by the assertion that there will remain danger of destruction of American property until a permanent garrison has been established in the valley. The Americans are waiting and hoping for restoration of order according to the latest advice to the State and Navy departments.

Help Colonists to Leave.

"It is said," a State Department summary stated, "that this arrangement was made in order to give the colonists an opportunity to leave the valley in comparative safety. It is reported that the losses suffered in the present raid are heavy, and that until a permanent garrison is established in the valley there will be danger of the destruction of American property."
