Secretary Garrison Defines What He Considers "Reasonable Preparation" for Defense.

Secretary Garrison defines what he considers "reasonable preparation" for the military defense of the United States in an article in the current issue of the Independent.

"It has been shown," writes the Secretary of War, "that the permanent military force needed to enable the government to comply with most of its constitutional obligations cannot be reliably maintained and that the most comparatively small increase in that permanent force is all that is necessary to enable it to perform its all-important function—that of training a citizen soldiery."

He says a less militaristic nation than this country has scarcely, if ever, existed on the face of the earth; and he draws attention to the trouble along the Mexican border, with the comment that much of the avoidance of this trouble has been due to the perfect discipline established by the training of the men of the regular army.
