DISCHARGES THE RULE ISSUED IN SUIT ON BOND

Chief Justice Covington Holds Proceedings Were Not Properly Before Probate Court. Proceedings to recover on a bond of an administrator or executor by a distributee under an estate must be instituted in a court of law and the Probate Court lacks jurisdiction to compel a surety company to pay into the registry the penalty of the bond of a defaulting executor or administrator. Chief Justice Covington of the District Supreme Court so holds in an opinion filed today discharging a rule issued against the Illinois Surety Company of Chicago to show cause why it should not pay \$900 into court because the administrator of the estate of George W. Hutton had failed to pay an individual debt of \$1,000 due the estate. The opinion of the court directs the discharge of the rule.
