PLANS TO AMEND CURRENCY SYSTEM

Federal Reserve Board Aims to Correct Deficiencies Shown During Year.

Evolving the results of year's experience in the operations of the new currency system, the federal reserve board contemplates amendments to the law designed to strengthen the system and to correct badly working provisions and errors in the original federal reserve act.

Although the board has not yet given any formal approval, there are more than a dozen suggestions which individual members regard as of sufficient importance to warrant favorable action.

Another amendment which has found favor would require member banks of the reserve system immediately to pay in their contributions to the capital stock of their reserve bank and deposit the total amount of reserves, instead of spreading these operations over a period of thirty-six months, as the existing law provides.

Banks in Excellent Shape. Reports of the controller of the currency show that the banks of the country are in excellent shape. It is regarded as probable that they could meet such new requirements, which would increase the resources of the twelve federal banks by several hundred million dollars, without interfering with current business.

The proposed to authorize member banks to appoint joint correspondents abroad and other plans for strengthening the financial relations with foreign countries are expected to be presented to Congress in some form.

HSH-SHI-CHANG RESIGNS PREMIERSHIP OF CHINA

Believed to Be Out of Sympathy With Movement to Restore Monarchy.

Notice has been received by the State Department of the resignation of Hsu-Shi-Chang, Chinese premier, but the cablegram announcing this fact gave no reason for the act.

The United States has declined to express any opinion as to whether it approves the proposed change in China from a republic to a monarchy.

Reasons for U. S. Attitude. This is based not only on the natural sympathy for the republican form of government, but because of the belief that the change might affect the political equilibrium of the far east at this time.

German Government's Instructions to Submarines Issued Month Before Arabic Was Attacked.

"PICKLE" NO LONGER WASTE.

Tin Plate Refuse Found to Contain Valuable By-Product.

PITTSBURGH, Pa., October 30.—"Pickle," which heretofore has been allowed to go to waste after removing the scale in the manufacture of tin plate and galvanized wire, has been found to contain paint pigment colorings, a valuable by-product. Experiments here have proved so successful that one of the large tinning plants has authorized the construction of a laboratory for the recovery of the

acids and the manufacture of coloring pigments from the solids derived. The various tints of color are attained by subjecting the material to different degrees of heat. It is said that enough of the material is recovered from the pickling liquid thrown away daily to make it a valuable source of revenue.


