Action is a Reflection of the Movement in the Stock on Wall Street.

Gain of Twelve Points on Common in One Day—Other Securities Move Slowly—Bonds Firm.

BY I. A. FLEMING. Sensational action on American Graphophone shares in the New York market was reflected by like action locally.

Yesterday's bid price was 124 for the common and 126 for the preferred stock. On New York exchange the late bid today was 137 for the common and 148 for the preferred.

Sales were made on the local stock exchange today at 137 1/2 to 137, with 144 1/2 bid for the preferred. The common stock sold ten days ago at 110.

Reliable information is to the effect that the Graphophone stock is exceeding over a year before the corporation will begin to show its good gains, also that insiders in the market are not too likely to buy of the present bull movement in stock.

Most of the local stock business is still on the old-foot order. In this trade, the Graphophone stock sold at 117 1/2, Railway common at 81 1/2 and 81 1/2, and Railway preferred at 81 1/2.

WEAK DULL, BUT FIRM. Specialties in the Industrial Group Develop the Best Strength on Wall Street.

Light Trading. Westinghouse Electric, Texas Oil and Cuban Sugar Make Goodly Gains. Rails Continue Very Slow.

NEW YORK, November 24.—Unquestionably the chief feature of today's stock market was the increasing dullness.

Following the custom of practically every opening hour for a week, stocks were very strong and higher early, reacting, as a rule, midway in the second hour and thereafter showing but little life.

There was more strength in the market than might have been expected from the action. The undertone is good and the feeling is higher early, reacting, as a rule, midway in the second hour and thereafter showing but little life.

Money is too plentiful for any reaction beyond present levels of material interest. The market is active and prices are higher than they have been for some time.

According to the gossip on the street, supposedly from inside sources, the next advance is to be under the leadership of one of the best factors among the industrials, Westinghouse Electric, busy as capacity can be in the market for the next few days.

The oil shares are acting especially well; indeed, they have been moving under the leadership of Texas Oil to higher prices for some days past.

Motor shares have had a generous reaction, and it is believed that they will continue to rise for some days past.

Traders generally chafe at the slow action in the market, and many operators are leaving for week-end outings rather than watch such limited operations.

It is in the season of the year for slow markets; records of the past demonstrate the Thanksgiving slowness and the subsequent dressing of windows for the holidays.

Rails Neglected Again. The rails were just as neglected as ever, but few sales being made.

At the same time there was no pressure to sell on any stock in the group other than New Haven, which was decidedly soft, with 1 1/2 points net loss.

The slowness in the rails, the indifference of the speculative fraternity to their activity, and the inability to inspire interest in their movements is so apparent that they could not be made leaders of any bull movement.

Of the specialties that developed material strength this morning Texas Oil, which is active with a rise to 21 1/2, after a temporary weakness, when the stock sold to 19 1/2. The high was a new record.

Canadian-American Sugar added 8 1/2 points to its price, making a new high at 150.

Crucible Fruit rose 4 points and Crucible Steel preferred on dividend paying 3 1/2 points.

Most of Minors Hold Their Own. Baldwin Locomotive rose 1 1/2 and lost the gain and a point additional. Maxwell Motors was 1/2 off. Studebaker, little better than nominal at 165 1/2, a fractional advance.

Although it sold to 70, but did not remain there. Industrial Alcohol was a point higher, and Crucible Steel 1/2 higher.

Mexican Petroleum was firm at 4 1/2, betterment, California Petroleum 1/2 higher, while Oilfielders was weak at 1/2 net loss.

Most of the minor industrials held their own, but with a high strength.

Improves a Little in Strength. In the early hours of the afternoon the market improved a little, and with the movement was slow and steady as in the morning.

Texas Oil made a new high at 21 1/2 and some other specialties made fractional advance, while Norfolk and Western, in the rails, gained a fraction.
