CONVICT FOUND GUILTY OF KILLING WARDEN'S WIFE

Jury at Joliet, Ill., Fixes Punishment at Hanging for Joseph Campbell, Negro Trusty.

JOLIET, Ill., November 28—Joseph Campbell, a negro convict, today was found guilty of murdering Mrs. Maise Odette Allen, wife of former Warden Allen, in the warden's apartments of the state penitentiary here. The verdict fixed the punishment at hanging and was returned after forty-four hours' deliberation by the jury. Mrs. Allen, formerly a star of musical comedy, was found murdered in her bed in the warden's suite at the state prison on the morning of June 20 last. Her skull was fractured and her body burned. Fire, by which the murderer is believed to have hoped to hide evidence of his crime, was discovered before the body was consumed.

McGUIRES WHARF RENEWED.

Pier in Nomini Creek Undergoing Complete Reconstruction.

McGuire wharf, in Nomini creek, now owned by S. J. Hopkins, is being rebuilt and made into a new structure. Already about half the structure has been completed and the piles have been driven for the remainder of the pier which will be completed in about ten days. McGuire wharf is one of the landing places in Nomini on the schedule of the Potomac and Chesapeake Steamboat Company, and it is visited several times each week by the steamer Wakefield. It is one of the more important wharves on the route of the Wakefield, and quantities of freight of all kinds pass over it on its way to and from this city.

High water, it is stated, has interfered with the rebuilding of the wharf of Johnson & Wimsatt at the foot of 12th street southwest. New stringers are being put in, and it is expected the work on the pier will be completed within the next week.
