President Gets Valentine. "Votes for Women" Token Sent by Congressional Union.

A "votes for women" valentine was sent to President Wilson today by the Congressional Union for Women Suffrage. It was in the form of a heart about a foot wide and a foot long, and bore a picture of a bevy of beautiful suffragists bearing streamers urging "votes for women."

Two Die From Cold. Mercury Two Degrees Above Zero in New York—Cold at Other Places.

NEW YORK, February 14.—A cold wave which sent the mercury down to degrees above zero caused the death of two men from exposure here today. The rapid drop in the temperature followed a two-day snowstorm. Four inches of snow fell and street and elevated traffic was badly hampered.

Gloversville, N. Y., February 14.—The official weather observer here reports that at 8 o'clock this morning the thermometer registered 23 below zero. Snowfalls from outlying districts were as low as 40 degrees.

Norfolk, Va., February 14.—The heaviest snow of the season fell here last night. The mercury stood at 19 degrees early today and the wind blew four miles an hour.

CHARLES L. GURLEY DIES FOLLOWING LONG ILLNESS
