

FORT MYER TROOPS LEAVE FOR BORDER Third Squadron of 5th United States Cavalry Entrain and Is on Its Way.

TRIP TO CONSUME FOUR DAYS TO COLUMBUS, N. M.

Col. Wilder, Commandant at Army Post, in Command—Train in Three Sections.

"It's cold up here, where the March winds blow. But they tell us it's hot down in Mexico."

So sang a scout trooper of the 5th Cavalry as he kicked his kit into a funny sack out at Roslyn Va. this morning and led his horse toward the door of a box car. A hundred and fifty khaki-clad figures, similarly equipped, showed their appreciation for his battery by joining in on the chorus.

The troops rode down from the fort with their full field equipment, the task of stowing the kit in duffel bags, unpadding and blanketing the horses, and packing the gear in short order, and men and animals took their places in the cars which have been waiting at Roslyn for the past week.

It is anticipated that the first and second squadrons of the 5th Cavalry, at Fort Sherman and Fort Lea'sworth, will join the third squadron and headquarters en route.


