DETAILED ACCOUNT OF BATTLE AT PARRAL REACHES FUNSTON

Two Americans Killed and Six Wounded, Including Maj. Tompkins, According to the Latter's Report.

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., April 17.—Gen. Funston has a report in detail of the encounter of Mexicans and American troops in Parral Wednesday, which it was said at his headquarters, indicated that the affair was more serious than former reports have made it appear.

Forty of the Mexican soldiers, including one major and one civilian, were killed by the retreating Americans. The American casualties were two killed and six wounded, including Maj. Tompkins. His wound was slight.

Regrets Maj. Tompkins' Retreat. Gen. Funston said that while Maj. Tompkins undoubtedly acted in accordance with his best judgment in retreating, he regretted that he had not made a stand on account of the ill effect on the Mexican people, who would naturally regard the incident as an American defeat.

Maj. Tompkins arrived outside Parral the forenoon of April 12 with two troops, a number of the total of these two troops is approximately 100 men. Parral appears to have been captured. Maj. Tompkins admitted that he did not march his small detachment quite openly along the trail outside Parral, where they were met by Gen. Lozano, who received them most graciously.


