NEW YORK, June 4.—Here you noticed in your neighborhood the new hat, which looks something like the one worn by a drum major and has a military strap under the chin? New York is quite enamored of it. It burst upon us about a month ago, and even the hardened veterans in this city, who are quite used to almost any novelty in clothes, paid a great deal of attention to this new piece of headgear.

Its career began at the smart afternoon dances, held at the Club de Vingt, the Coterie Club and the Biltmore, which are the membership places where smart women go to dance when they consent to dance at public places; and not only here, but later at the races, which have been swinging along in all their glory on Long Island.

No one is quite sure of the origin of this strap. The designers over here call it a revival of the 1840 millinery, but those who like to ascribe everything to the influence of the great war insist that the chin strap is taken from the dress parade hats of the soldiers.

True, no soldier in Europe has seen anything of dress parade clothes for twenty months, although in the heart of each one of them there must be a wish that nothing but such uniforms come speedily into fashion. However, the French designers do not draw their inspiration from the military clothes of the moment, but from those that have existed for a century or more.

No Need of Hat Pins.

There is a marked difference between the two varieties of hats that have been launched on a fashionable world. Each of these has the chin strap, both are small. One is definitely taken from soldiers, such as the one in the sketch,

## Wearing of Summer Furs.

The wearing of summer furs bids fair to be one of the season's fads. And the wearing of summer furs is no simple matter. One must know how to wear them if one would be successful with them.

The wearing of furs in winter is an easy matter. We don them to keep the cold out, and the matter is settled then and there. When we take them off, we again have time for months to make their appearance. Very often they are hung or placed in "closets" that are practically heated.

But in summer furs are beset with destruction on every side. The heat is ever present to fry them out. The sun is bright to fade them. Moths lurk in the background to devour them. So you see the necessity of wearing furs carefully, if you wear them in warm weather.

A woman noted for her smart manner of dressing has several pieces of fur for street use this year. They are all in the form of flat stoles, wide and long. And she wears them neatly tucked under the white linen or organdy evening dresses of serge or silk. Her method is admirable, or the washable collar keeps the fur from coming in contact with the skin and so serves a double purpose. The fur is not moistened by perspiration and the skin is not irritated by the heat of the fur. But the shoulders are covered very comfortably.

Keep your summer furs, when they are not in use, in a closet as cool as possible. If possible, keep them in a light closet, but one in which there is no sun. Summer sun and heat are ruinous to the quality of the fur, on the other hand, moths love the dark, and nothing is more ruinous to furs than moths.

Perhaps a good method is to have a stiff paper case in which to pack away each piece of fur when it is removed. Put the collar on hangers for coats, padded, and the surface of a double purpose. The fur is not moistened by perspiration and the skin is not irritated by the heat of the fur. But the shoulders are covered very comfortably.




GRANDFATHER FROG, SITTING ON HIS GREEN LILY PAD, SAW HER WHEN SHE ROLLED IN THE MUD.


