**CANAL COAL TRADE RESUMED.**

Barges Will Be Loaded at Georgetown This Week.

Shipments of coal from Georgetown piers to Boston and other ports in New England are to be resumed at once, and by the end of this week one of the big coal-carrying vessels of the Consolidation Coal Company should be here ready to load. Barge No. 2, which will be the first vessel to come here, left Boston Monday last and is due to pass in the capes of the Chesapeake today. In tow of the tug that towed her down the coast she will be brought up the bay and at the mouth of the Potomac will be taken in charge by the tug James O. Carter of this city. The tug and her tow are due to arrive here some time tomorrow, and the loading of the vessel will be started at once. By Monday she will be loaded and will take away about 1,600 tons of soft coal. From now until the end of the shipping season a barge or two will be loaded each week and started north.
