


ONE OF UNCLE SAM'S MOTOR REPAIR TRUCKS IN SERVICE.

FORCE OF 500,000 MEN REQUIRES 8,000 TRUCKS

Figures Are Given by Maj. Francis Lawton of U. S. Army Commissary Department.

A force of 500,000 men requires more than 8,000 trucks, on the basis of a one-and-half ton capacity, is the statement of Maj. Francis Lawton of the commissary department of the east. U. S. A., who bases his assertion on a study of motor equipment requirements of the armies in the European war.
