Primary Election Full of Surprises and Food for Serious Thought.

SUCCESS OF MARTINE NOT POSITIVE REBUKE

Democrats 100,000 Short of Usual Enrollment—Defeat of Former Gov. Murphy.

Special Dispatch to The Star. NEWARK, N. J., September 30.—New Jersey politicians of both parties are still rubbing their eyes over the result of Tuesday's primary election in this state.

Both party machines got a severe jolt. The independent tendencies displayed by the voters in this election are not to be underestimated.

The defeat of Franklin Murphy, republican organization candidate for United States senator, of John W. Westcott, the administration's candidate for the same office, and the victory of Edward Burke Osborne, anti-machine candidate for state senator from Essex county, were the notable features.

Rebuke Not Positive. The primary figures do not bear out the contention. If there was a rebuke of the administration it was negative rather than positive.

Defeat of Murphy. Seldon has the old guard received a greater shock than in the victory of Joseph S. Frelinghuysen over former Gov. Franklin Murphy for the republican nomination for United States senator.
