

JAMES CROGGON'S LIFE ENLARGED BY FRIENDS

Deceased Veteran Newspaper Man Subject of Much Praise at Church Gathering.

Members of the Sons of Jonadab and of the Association of Oldest Inhabitants of the District of Columbia, as well as many friends, gathered at McKendree M. E. Church last night and paid tribute to the memory of the late James Croggon, veteran newspaper man, lifelong resident of Washington and last surviving founder of the Sons of Jonadab.

Following the address by Rev. Francis M. McCoy, pastor of Waugh M. E. Church, of which Mr. Croggon was a member, Charles E. Croggon, secretary of the Sons of Jonadab, gave reminiscences of the founding of the order and of the important part Croggon played in its work.

Mr. Croggon was a good newspaper man, said Mr. Kaufmann. "No one who wrote for the editor of the Star would call him a mistake in any of his articles—he always knew thoroughly the subject on which he was writing."

Mr. Croggon was rated a "royal mad" by Joseph E. Colton, of Pioneer Council, No. 1, of the Sons of Jonadab.

"He was a royal man because he was a victor," said Mr. Colton. "Every newspaper man is beset with temptations, but Brother Croggon was not one of them all and came out clean. He was pure in thought and word, and one never heard an unclean word from him."

That Washington owes Mr. Croggon a great debt for his work of building men was the declaration of Rev. L. Morgan Chambers, pastor of McKendree Church, and a member of Pioneer Council, No. 1.

NATIONAL PISTOL MATCH WON BY GEORGE E. COOK

Brings Another of the Highest Annual Shooting Classic Honors to Washington.

Special Dispatch to The Star. JACKSONVILLE, Fla., October 26.—George E. Cook of the Military Service Legion Rifle Club, with the civilian club team from the District at the national rifle matches on the state camp range here, won the national pistol match yesterday, thereby bringing another of the highest of the annual shooting classic honors to Washington.

The District civilian team as a whole finished eleventh among the first fifteen class A teams in the national team rifle matches. Every man on the team received a medal. The District all-high school team finished twenty-third, or twelfth in class B, with an aggregate score of 2,874.

The Marine Corps team won the national matches to a close, with a score of 4,320 out of 4,800 points. The all-National Guard team was second with 4,212 points, and the all-civilian team third with 4,120 points.
