FRENCH CAPTURE MOST OF SAILLISEL. Fighting at Town on Somme Front Continues, According to Paris.

GERMAN ATTACK FAILS. By the Associated Press. PARIS, November 11.—North of the Somme, the French have retaken the greater part of Saillise village. The fighting continues, according to the bulletin issued by the war office tonight. South of the Somme there has been chiefly artillery action.

French Communication. PARIS, November 11, via London. November 12.—The French statement reads: "We delivered this afternoon a sharp attack on the village of Saillise (on the Bapaume-Peronne road) a greater part of which we recaptured. Our troops are occupying the north-eastern and southeastern outskirts. The struggle continues in the eastern part of the village, where the enemy is still resisting desperately. The number of prisoners counted up to now exceeds 100, including four officers."

Steel Works Bombaraded. "Between 10 and 11 o'clock on the morning of November 10 a group of seventeen British aeroplanes bombarded the steel works at Pocklington (Volkling) northwest of Saarbrucken. One thousand kilograms of projectiles were dropped on the buildings, which were damaged seriously. In the course of the operation British machines fought several actions against enemy machines, three of which were felled. On the following night eight enemy aeroplanes executed a fresh bombardment of these works, dropping 1,600 kilograms of projectiles. Several fires were observed. All our machines are returned safely."

French Towns Shelled. "A German airplane during the night of November 10-11 bombarded several French towns. Nancy and Luneville received projectiles which caused damage or casualties. The open town of Amiens also was bombarded on several occasions during the same night. Ten persons of the civilian population were killed and twenty-seven injured."

British Official Report. LONDON, November 11.—The British official communication issued this evening reads as follows: "Some sixty prisoners, including four officers, were taken as a result of last night's successful attacks. Yesterday there was again considerable activity in the air. During the day bombing raids were continued with effect against enemy billets, aerodromes and headquarters, and at night enemy stations and trains were successfully attacked. Two trains being hit by bombs, while a third was set on fire and a number of explosions followed."

Tells of Bombing Raid. BERLIN, November 11, by wireless to Sayville.—The following announcement is from the admiralty: "On the night of November 8-10 hostile aeroplanes dropped bombs without success on Ostend and Zebrugge (Belgium). One British machine was forced down and captured, and the aviator a British officer, was made prisoner."

Big Aerial Battle Fought. The British war office announced Friday night that thirty British aeroplanes had encountered a hostile squadron of thirty to forty machines, which was dispersed after a battle during which six of the hostile machines were observed to begin to turn out of control, although they were not seen to fall to the ground. Nine other German aeroplanes were observed to have been driven down in damaged condition as a result of various encounters. The bombardment of Ostend and Zebrugge, it was announced, was attended with "satisfactory results." Seven British machines were said to be missing.

USE OF ARTIFICIAL GAS. Increasing as Domestic Fuel; Decreasing as an Illuminant. That the use of artificial gas as a domestic and industrial fuel is increasing and that its utilization for illuminating purposes is decreasing is indicated by a report recently issued by the Department of the Interior, which covers the use of the product in 1915.

It is pointed out that 266,204,248,000 cubic feet of gas were used in 1915, and that the value of this production amounted to \$173,822,132, according to statistics collected by the Geological Survey of the United States geological survey, and 129,193,346,000 cubic feet of coal gas was consumed in the same period, valued at \$48,882,007.

The statistics show that 50 per cent of the gas was used for illuminating, 48 per cent for domestic fuel and 22 per cent for industrial fuel.
