

FIGHT FOR GOVERNORSHIP TO BE TAKEN TO COURT

R. E. Campbell's Attorneys Notify G. W. P. Hunt of Application for Writ of Mandamus.

PHOENIX, Ariz., January 2.—Interest in the efforts of G. W. P. Hunt, democratic claimant to the office of governor of Arizona, to prevent occupancy of the office by Thomas E. Campbell, republican, who was formally inaugurated yesterday, centers now in the probable legal steps expected to follow.

Attorneys for Campbell last night served notice on Hunt of application for a writ of mandamus. The matter has been set for hearing Thursday morning. Another development of the night was a proffer from friends of Gov. Hunt of a surrender of the office on the condition that the inspection of the ballots be stopped at once and the contest proper be begun on the discoveries that have been made so far in the inspection of the more than half the ballots. The proffer was rejected by Campbell.

An armed deputy sheriff, acting, he said, on the authority of Leroy Ladd, Hunt's private secretary, prevented Campbell adherents from occupying the governor's office yesterday. A suggestion by the Campbell men that the doors be broken down provoked cheers from the inspection which witnessed the inauguration, but Campbell counseled the employment of orderly means, and the crowd quietly dispersed.

OPENS ITS 122d SESSION.

Pennsylvania Legislature Starts Work

E. J. Baldwin Elected Speaker.

HARRISBURG, Pa., January 2.—The Pennsylvania legislature began its 122d session today. Richard J. Baldwin of Delaware county was elected speaker of the house and Senator Edward E. Beldeman of Dauphin county was re-elected president pro tempore of the senate.

Leut. Gov. McClain in an address in opening the session of the senate said the legislature has enacted a perfect horde of laws to regulate everybody and everything.

"We have had an overdose of the didactic," he said, "to my mind the time has come to 'throw in the reverse,' particularly in application to laws and regulations discouraging industrial development and commercial expansion."

Minnesota Legislature Meets.

ST. PAUL, Minn., January 2.—The Minnesota legislature convenes today with the prospect of acting on state-wide prohibition, woman suffrage, re-organization of various state departments and repeal of the boxing bill before adjournment by time limitation on April 15. Gov. J. A. A. Burnquist will inaugurate tomorrow for a two-year term.






