

DIVIDED VIEWS GIVEN ON COLOMBIAN PACT

Majority and Minority Reports of Foreign Relations Committee Made Public.

MR. KNOX EXPLAINS STAND

Divided views of the Senate foreign relations committee on the treaty to pay Colombia \$25,000,000 for the partition of Panama were made public today before the Senate began debate on the subject.

"The treaty," says the report which favors the convention, "should be considered solely on its merits as a question of present moment, without regard to the circumstances out of which the long-standing differences between Colombia and the United States originated."

Alleges No Just Claim.

The minority report, which opposes the treaty, denies that the United States was guilty of any misconduct in connection with the partition of Panama, and asserts that the "Colombian government has no just or equitable claim against this nation for an act on our part in connection therewith."

MR. KNOX GIVES VIEWS.

Senator Knox, the only republican of the committee who voted to approve the treaty, made a statement of his individual views, saying: "There exists a real and long-standing difference between the United States and Colombia. In the interest of peace and good will, it is our wish to compromise that difference, which is to be done upon the well known principle that the compromise of a difference need carry no implication of wrong on either part."

PLEA FOR RECRUITS SAME AS USED BY WASHINGTON

CHICAGO, March 15.—A reproduction of the poster used by George Washington in raising the Continental army of 1776 is contained in a new army recruiting poster which has made its appearance on the streets here. Capt. F. R. Kenney, in charge of army recruiting in Chicago, laid out the poster several weeks ago and authorities at Washington approved it before it was printed. It is headed "The father of our country appealed for soldiers as follows:

LONDON, March 15.—The death of the Duchess of Connaught is announced. The Duchess of Connaught, wife of the Duke of Connaught, uncle of King George and former Governor General of Canada, was seized with a bronchial attack last February and during her convalescence bronchial pneumonia developed. She had been seriously ill for several days.

CANNOT BUILD COLLIERIES.

Shipmakers Too Busy to Take Panama Canal Contracts Now. Overcrowded with marine construction of every kind, none of the shipbuilding concerns of the country can be induced to undertake to build two colliers for the Panama canal, and the prospects have been abandoned for the present, according to the Canal Record.

Asks Inquiry Into Election.

A petition signed by former Senator Chilton of West Virginia, asking an inquiry into the election of his successor, Howard Sutherland, has been filed in the Senate by Senator Simmons. It was referred to the committee on privileges and elections. The petition alleges that Mr. Sutherland spent more as a candidate for the republican nomination than the West Virginia laws allow; that he violated the corrupt practices act of that state and that in other ways Mr. Chilton was denied his rights in the case.

ONCE UNWELCOME IN GALLERY OF CONGRESS. WOMAN NOW IS MEMBER

Now that the first Congress-woman is coming to town, Miss Jeannette Rankin, it is interesting to note that in the earlier days of Congress women were not even welcomed in the gallery. "Mr. Speaker," snarled John Randolph, one of the forebears of the present mistress of the White House, pointing at several women who had the temerity to enter the visitors' gallery, "what, pray, are all these women doing here, so out of place in this arena? Sir, they had much better be at home attending to their knitting."

NAVY'S BEST VOLUNTEER FOR GUN CREWS ON SHIPS

The cream of the United States Navy has volunteered to serve as gun crews aboard the American merchantmen which will soon sail the seas armed to resist attack by German submarines.

This information comes from the Navy Department, where applicants have been pouring in from gunners, gunner's mates, ensigns and lieutenants of the line, the assumption being that men of these classes and grades will compose the personnel of the gun crews.

The American practice in the case of extra-hazardous service, such as will be performed by these men, is that only volunteers will be ordered to duty. Notable instances in history are those of Cushing and his men in the famous torpedo attack on the Albatross and Lieut. Hobson in his exploit of sinking the Merrimac.

The number of guns and the strength of the guard on the various ships will determine the rank of the naval officer to be placed in command. The Navy Department will make no publication of the composition of the guard, the guns carried or the dates of departure of any merchantman placed under the protection of the government.

GIVEN ANOTHER MONTH TO CLEAR UP TRACKS

I. C. C. Satisfied With Efforts of Railroads to Relieve Car Shortage.

The railroads of the country have been given another month's grace by the Interstate Commerce Commission to solve car shortage and congestion problems. The commission announced that recent drastic rules for the return of foreign cars to owning lines would be further suspended until April 15.

Improvement in Conditions.

Reports to the American Railway Association from virtually every railroad in the country, just made public, placed the total of loaded and empty freight cars tied up by congestion throughout the United States March 3 at 123,053, a reduction of 20,487 during the week ending that date.

Chicago Wants More Cars.

Mr. Griffin requested the railroads to furnish more cars to Chicago interests. The car service commission advised him that the railroads were taking all steps in their power to relieve congestion everywhere, and that they would do all possible to grant Chicago the relief desired.

Five-Man and Individual Events Furnish Excitement at Congress.

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., March 15.—All three leaders in the American Bowling Congress tournament here withstood the attacks of yesterday's work, but two new second place names appeared in the standing, the five-man and individual event high marks being threatened. The big attack came in the five-man event where no fewer than four teams had a chance to pass the 2,932 of the Hotel Navarres of Toledo. The most threatening onslaught came from another Toledo club, the Mitchell Six No. 1 team, captained by Bill Elwert, former ball player. Elwert's team ran 2,913 for second position and the Malpas of Rochester, N. Y., took fourth place, with 2,901. The Eastern Markets, Detroit, rolled into fifth place, with 2,894.

Asks Court for Appam Mandate.

The Supreme Court of the United States was asked today by British owners of the German prize ship Appam, at Newport News, Va., to waive its usual thirty-day delay and issue its mandate at once for immediate restoration of the ship and cargo to the British claimants, decreed to be entitled to their return.
