

JAPAN PAYS HIGH HONOR TO GUTHRIE

Intended to Show Esteem for Ambassador Who Died at Tokio.

Japan's offer of a warship to bring home the body of the late Ambassador Guthrie was formally accepted today.

Officials today expressed gratification at the signal honors accorded the late ambassador by both the Japanese government and people.

A long cablegram has been received at the State Department from Chosei Wheeler, at Tokio, describing the extraordinary honors paid the late Ambassador Guthrie by Japan.

"No mark of honor, public or private has been withheld in all these ceremonies," said the charge, "and in this telegram I cannot adequately express the extreme consideration which the Japanese government, official and unofficial, has shown in this sad event."

The minister of foreign affairs, in a communication requesting me to tender my government, in the name of the imperial government, his sincere condolences, stated:

Brought Nations Closer. "It gives me high gratification that since his excellency came to this country in 1913 to represent his country as its ambassador, the friendly relations between the two countries have grown closer and firmer than ever."

Mr. Wheeler reported the offer of the foreign minister, in testimony "to the sentiments of sincere sympathy and attachment entertained by Japan toward the United States," to convey the body of the ambassador home in a Japanese warship. This tender has been accepted, and, in accordance with the request of Japan, the warship will be exempted from strict application of the neutrality laws limiting the stay of belligerent warships in American ports and restricting their provisioning.

Plans for State Funeral. Following the precedent established in the case of the funeral of the late American Ambassador Whitelaw Reid, the State Department will take charge of the ceremonies preceding the funeral in this country of Ambassador Guthrie.

An American naval officer will receive the commander of the Japanese cruiser which will bring the body to San Francisco. The State Department will be represented by an official and a special train of two cars will be provided by the government to convey the funeral party, including some of the members of the late ambassador's family, from San Francisco to Pittsburgh, where it is understood the municipality will conduct the funeral.

Emperor Represented at Funeral. TOKIO, March 13 (delayed).—The presence of Prince and Princess Nashimoto, personally representing the emperor and empress, and several other princes and princesses of royal blood at the funeral services today for the late George W. Guthrie, American ambassador to Japan, added to the imposing tributes paid to the late diplomat by both court and government officials.

The Japanese government provided a special funeral train for the transportation of the body to Yokohama. YOKOHAMA, March 13 (delayed).—There was an impressive demonstration here when the train bearing the body of the late George W. Guthrie, American ambassador to Japan, arrived. The funeral cortege, escorted by the mayor and guard of honor, passed through the silent streets, which were crowded with many thousands of Japanese. Business was suspended in all public buildings as the coffin, wrapped in the American flag, was borne past.

The Japanese government has invited Mrs. Guthrie to accompany the body on the Japanese warship which will convey it to the United States. The honors tendered the late ambassador are the greatest ever accorded a foreigner by Japan and have made a deep impression on Americans.

GUTHRIE FUNERAL PLANS. State Department to Take Charge of Obsequies for Ambassador.

Following the precedent established in the case of the funeral of the late American Ambassador Whitelaw Reid, the State Department will take charge of the obsequies of the late Ambassador Guthrie, who died in Tokio last Thursday.

When the body arrives at San Francisco an American naval officer will represent the Navy Department in receiving the commander of the Japanese cruiser which will bring the body to the United States. The State Department will also be represented by one of its officials and a special train of two cars will be provided by the government to convey the funeral party including some of the members of the late ambassador's family, from San Francisco to Pittsburgh, where it is understood the municipality will conduct the funeral.
