




"The new social conscience that calls for the preservation of the character of the young manhood of America is only another manifestation of what we know as the rotary ideal."

PRECEDENT IS BROKEN BY P. O. DEPARTMENT

For First Time Makes Public Name of Newspaper Cited Under Espionage Act.

The Post Office Department last evening broke a precedent by making public for the first time the name of a publication which has been cited for a hearing on charges of violating the provisions of the espionage act.

This was done by giving out a telegram addressed to the New York Call, following a letter to the department, printed in that newspaper, demanding specific reasons why the department questioned its right to the second-class mailing privilege.

Argument Advanced. One argument advanced by those who favor such revocation is that the present rule permits publications to state their side of the case, but gives the government no opportunity to reply.
