FORMER CANADIAN PREMIER IS DEAD

Sir Wilfrid Laurier Victim of Paralysis—Had Notable Career.

By the Associated Press. OTTAWA, February 18.—Sir Wilfrid Laurier, former premier of Canada, died of paralysis here yesterday afternoon.

The body will lie in state in the house of commons from Thursday until Saturday, according to tentative plans for the funeral.

Saturday morning the casket will be taken to Sacred Heart Church, where mass will be celebrated by Archbishop Mathieu of Regina, an intimate friend of the late opposition leader.

Born at St. Lin, Quebec, in 1841, Sir Wilfrid was the only French Canadian who was ever premier of Canada, a portfolio he held from 1896 to 1911.

Career in Politics. Sir Wilfrid's career in politics antedated the federation of the provinces into the Dominion of Canada in 1867. Then only a few years out of McGill University, he actively opposed this union, but when it had been consummated, he accepted the verdict and was elected to the provincial legislature of Quebec as a liberal in 1871, resigning three years later and being elected to the house of commons, where he took an active part in the liberal majority.

Notable Achievements. After holding the premiership for fifteen years Sir Wilfrid's government suffered defeat at the polls with the proposed reciprocity treaty with the United States as the paramount issue. Sir Wilfrid supporting this project.

Notable achievements of the Laurier regime were the granting of preferential tariff for British products, the granting of autonomy to the provinces of Saskatchewan and Alberta, the participation of Canada with the British forces in the South African war and the inauguration of the Grand Trunk Pacific transcontinental railway scheme. He was instrumental in securing from the British government a loan to Belgium and Germany of the denunciation of treaties with those countries which stood in the way of Canada's new tariff extending a preference to the United Kingdom.

MUCH WAR RELIEF WORK DONE AT HUBBARD HALL. Twentieth Century Club Reports Many Surgical Dressings and Other Articles Produced.

Accompanying a letter of thanks from the Twentieth Century Club to the board of managers of the National Geographic Society for the use of Hubbard Memorial Hall since November, 1917, for war relief work, is a report showing the remarkable amount of work done there.

The report shows that 30,000 surgical dressings, 2,300 machine-made garments, 1,000 knitted articles and 1,000 miscellaneous articles, including comfort bags and influenza masks, were made. Mrs. Lyman B. Swormsted is chairman of the war relief committee of the Twentieth Century Club, of which Mrs. Gilbert Groves is president.

The club also used the room for its part in the liberty loan and Red Cross drives and parades and for board meetings. More than 200 pupils attended the surgical dressings class conducted by the club and many of these pupils, after graduating, established other auxiliaries.

WOULD HAVE LEAGUE EMBODIED IN TREATY

Northwestern Congress Urges Step for Humanity—Mr. Taft on Senator Poindexter's Opposition.

PORTLAND, Ore., February 18.—By acclamation the northwestern congress for a league of nations yesterday adopted a platform declaring that a treaty of peace, of which the formation of a league of nations is an essential part, shall be ratified by the Senate of the United States and that America shall take its place among the great nations subscribing thereto, not only for the good of the nation, but also for the peaceful welfare of mankind. Former President Taft presided.

Senator Poindexter's Opposition. Referring to criticism of the covenant by Senator Poindexter, Mr. Taft said that these sentiments if uttered during the war "would have been out of tune with the overflowing spirit of the American people and their determination to win this war and end the possibility of such war in the future."

Mr. Taft Discusses League. "The constitution as read in Paris by President Wilson is indeed wider in the scope of its purposes than was the platform of our League to Enforce Peace," said Mr. Taft, in describing the purpose of the league.

Boycott Formidable. "The punishment of a universal boycott is a very formidable instrument of repression. We may reasonably hope that this prospect will minimize the temptation to make war and to secure the object of the league."

U. S. Pledged to League Idea. "In the President's addresses and messages during the war and since he has promised the long-harassed peoples of the allied and associated United States would press for a league of nations which should secure permanent peace when the war ended. This nation is thus pledged to the idea of a league of nations to render peace permanent."

PRESBYTERIANS RAISE \$5,075. Make Success in Campaign to Reduce Debt on Church.

The Sixth Presbyterian Church congregation went "over the top" last night in its drive to secure \$5,000 to reduce a debt of \$9,000 on the church.

Final count of the subscriptions last night showed that the goal has been exceeded by \$75. The winning team, which was captained by Benjamin R. Skinner, in \$77. The team captained by M. A. Skinner was second and the team of Joseph C. Fish was third.

Auditors, Accountants and Examiners to Be Placed. A call for 350 auditors, 500 accountants and 50 examiners of accounts was sent out from Washington today by the Civil Service Commission.

The auditors are wanted for the income tax branch of the revenue bureau, which pays entrance salaries from \$3,000 to \$4,500 a year. The accountants are wanted for the ordinary division, and will be paid entrance salaries from \$2,200 to \$4,200. Half of the accountants must be of junior class and will be paid from \$1,200 to \$2,000 a year.

Men only may take the examination for the fifty vacancies for examiners of accounts in the Interstate Commerce Commission, which pay entrance salaries from \$1,800 to \$2,100 a year. Applications will be received by the Civil Service Commission until further notice.


