

PURCHASE OF LAND FOR PARKS IS URGED

Chamber of Commerce Directors Also Plan Drive for 200 New Members.

Purchase of several tracts of land in various parts of the District for park purposes was recommended at a meeting last night of the board of directors of the Chamber of Commerce. The land the government is urged to acquire and convert to recreational uses includes the Patterson tract, Mount Hamilton tract, Dean tract, Klingle Ford tract, the land reserved for the extension of the Finney Branch parkway and the Fort Drive tract.

The board urged the immediate acquisition of these tracts because of the necessity for extending and enlarging the park and recreational facilities, and as the land may be expected to increase materially in value in the next few years.

Urge Dormitories' Removal.

Construction by the government of homes to be rented to government workers at reasonable rates also was urged by the board last night, and removal as speedily as possible of present temporary dormitories and other residential structures on the ground of unsuitability and unsightliness was recommended.

In the interests of the campaign for 200 new members of the chamber, decided upon at Monday night's meeting, a committee of ten was named to wage the campaign in conjunction with the regular membership committee. Sidney West, chairman of the committee, submitted names of six candidates, who were elected to membership. These were Maj. Edward M. Parker, Clarence E. Fries, Charles B. Campbell, A. F. Williams, Jr., Joseph Baruch and W. E. Cadwalader.

Those designated to work with the membership committee are Ralph Lee, C. L. Houser, Samuel A. Kimberley, Isaac Gans, Chapin Brown, Robert N. Harper, James W. Peck, Miss Mary O'Toole, Appleton P. Clark, Jr., and A. F. Joras. A list of 4,000 names already has been compiled by William B. Hardy, secretary of the membership committee of the chamber, for the use of the canvassers.

Legion Invited to Meet Here.

An urgent invitation was extended to the American Legion to hold its next convention in the National Capital and also to establish national headquarters in this city.

The board last night decided to extend invitations to Gen. Pershing, Vice President Marshall, former Speaker Clark and members of the congressional District committee to attend the fall meetings of the chamber. Advisory committees to aid in the field survey of the congressional commission on the reclassification of salaries will be appointed today.

MONACO FLIES RED AND WHITE FLAG

Geographic Society Tells of Tiniest Nation and San Marino, Next Smallest.

How many flags do you recognize? "Though the world is crowded to familiarize us with flags of some of our allies, the average person's repertoire of flags still does not exceed half a dozen," says a bulletin from the Washington headquarters of the National Geographic Society.

"Flags are important not only as patriotic emblems, but many times the histories of nations are symbolized in their flags."

The red and white flag of Monaco floats over the principality on the earth. The entire area of the territory, whose symbol of authority it is, is only eight square miles. Although it is smallest in area, there are three smaller in population. It has 23,000 inhabitants as compared with 12,521 for Andorra, 10,716 for Liechtenstein and 11,513 for San Marino.

Monaco is a principality on the Mediterranean, surrounded by the French department of Alpes-Maritimes, except on the side toward the sea. After 965 A.D. it belonged to the house of Grimaldi. The reigning prince was Louis I. He was a French revolutionary, in 1792, and died in 1795. In 1814 the principality was re-established under the protection of the kingdom of Sardinia by the treaty of Vienna in 1815. The prince was Charles III. He and Rocca-bruna (now known as Honoré) revolted and declared themselves independent.

"The prince thereupon ceded his rights over them to France and the principality thus became geographically an enclave of France, with the Sardinian garrison was withdrawn and the protectorate established in 1816. The prince was an absolute ruler until 1811, when a representative government was set up.

"San Marino claims to be the oldest state in Europe. Next to Monaco, it is in area the smallest independent country in the world. It has thirty square miles of territory and a population of 11,513. The coat-of-arms consists of three hills in gold upon a field of blue. These hills are Monte Guaito, Monte Cucco and Monte Titano, each bearing a castle surrounded by a plume. The shield has a gold crown as a crest and is surrounded by branches of laurel and oak united by a ribbon inscribed with the word "Liberty."

"The ensign of the republic of San Marino consists of a field the upper part of which is blue and the lower half white. The coat-of-arms is centered on it.

"With its field shared by yellow and red, the national banner of the principality of Liechtenstein flies over a nation having an area of sixty-five square miles.

"The blue, yellow and red flag of Andorra, with its coronet in the center, is the youngest thing in the nation. It is only fifty years old, having originated in the reform of 1863 to emphasize the autonomy of the valley; but neither of the co-princes has approved it. It is displayed when the council is in session."

Refugees Badly in Need of Thread.

"Thread is one of the most valuable items in our list of relief supplies," writes an American Red Cross representative who is at work in camp of Russian refugees in the eastern part of Czechoslovakia. "Ordinary cotton thread is practically unobtainable in this part of the country, and it is surprising how much these refugees can do for themselves if we merely supply them with thread. There is the same scarcity of thread in all parts of Czechoslovakia. In Prague a fourteen-pound goose has been traded for a 5-cent spool of white cotton."

An explosion of a boiler at the Johnson ginney at Baxley, Ga., killed three men when the entire structure was lifted into the air and dropped back on men standing outside the building Saturday. The dead are A. B. Dunn, W. L. Crosby and Will Brown, colored.

MRS. BURLESON HEADS DRAMATIC CLUBS HERE

Federation Arranging Group of Plays to Be Presented During November.

Mrs. A. S. Burleson was unanimously elected chairman of the Federated Dramatic Clubs of Washington and that organization is now making arrangements for a group of plays, each to be given by one of the clubs forming the federation, during November. C. H. Gifford is vice chairman and A. H. Winter secretary-treasurer. The various committees are to be organized within two weeks.

The purpose of the federation is to bring together the play-producing organizations of the National Capital, and all such organizations which are not now members are invited to send in their applications for membership. The clubs now members of the federation and the present representatives on the board of directors are Dramatic League Players, C. H. Gifford; Home Club Players, A. H. Winter; Playgroup Players, Mrs. Susie Rhodes; Readers' Club, Mrs. Maud Howell Smith; Post Office Dramatic Club, J. Warren Seamage; Washington Players, C. W. O'Connor; George Washington University Players, W. C. Burton; War Camp Community Service Players, Mrs. Marie Moore Forrest; War Risk Insurance Players, Mrs. Marie Downer Werner.

It is also intended to have an associate membership to be composed of organizations interested in the writing, reading or studying of plays or otherwise interested in this character, but not actively engaged in the production of plays. Organizations of this kind are now being communicated with and the secretaries of such organizations are requested to forward their names to the chairman.

A committee has been appointed and is now canvassing the city for a suitable place for the initial productions of the federation.

VOCATIONAL BOARD AIDS IN CASES OF EMERGENCY

Disabled Service Men in Training Tided Over Difficulties, Including Financial Embarrassment.

If a disabled man in training abates himself from his work, has sickness in his family or is ill himself, or if he becomes financially embarrassed or dissatisfied with his course, the Federal Board for Vocational Education provides a way to help him in his difficulty.

Personal counselors are selected at each center where disabled men are in training, whose special function it is to be a real friend to those who need him. It is the endeavor of the board to relieve the relationship between it and the disabled man from becoming mechanical, and these personal advisers are named with the idea of keeping in mind the ambitions and hopes of these soldiers who have lost much physical strength through service. Whatever offers the best promise for the ultimate success of the disabled man is arranged by the board, where possible.

For this reason the tutorial method of training has been provided for some disabled soldiers. This is done both in institutions and in training on the job. It has been found especially helpful in increasing the effectiveness of correspondence courses.
