

PLAY YOUR TALENT "WORLD DRY" MOVE

Miss Gordon, W. C. T. U. Head, and Miss Deane, Editor, to Go Abroad.

CHICAGO, December 27 (by the Associated Press).—As a steed in the "world dry" movement, Miss Anna Adams Gordon, president of the National Women's Christian Temperance Union, and Miss Julia F. Deane, editor of the Union Signal, the organization's official publication, plan to travel through Europe, Asia, Africa and South America. Miss Gordon announced here today. Passports to Europe already have been obtained. The tour of Europe will be begun in April, Miss Gordon said, to be followed by visits to the orient, South Africa and South America in turn. "We will make a survey of the situation in the countries as it now is," Miss Gordon said. "We will carry the enthusiasm of America to them, aid them in building up their work through the organizations now existing in each country we will visit and tell them of the results obtained here."

After attending the world W. C. T. U. convention in London in April, 1920, Miss Gordon said she and Miss Deane would travel through England, returning to America in time to attend the national W. C. T. U. convention at Atlantic City in November, 1920. As soon after that as feasible the tour of the other continents would be started.

Gives Itinerary.
The initial itinerary, she said, includes England, Ireland, Scotland, Switzerland, Italy, Spain, Portugal, Greece, France, Belgium, Holland, Denmark, Sweden and Norway.

"The world convention, Miss Gordon said, 'ordinarily is a biennial gathering, but because of the war none has been held in six years.' Much important work, she indicated, will have to be done in the interim, which will be representative of forty nations.

"Each of the countries we will visit has an organization affiliated with the American W. C. T. U.," she continued. "It will be through those bodies that our efforts will be directed."

"We have received invitations from many of them repeatedly to come to them and have been invited to visit all the countries to which we will go."

Refers to Wood Alcohol Deaths.
Miss Gordon said that the W. C. T. U. was looking into the increasing number of deaths reported through drinking of wood alcohol and that something soon would be done about it. She added, however, "the number of deaths caused by that poison would not compare with the number caused by drinking so-called 'good whisky.'"

GERMANS ASK TONNAGE FIGURE WITH PROTOCOL

Would Have Scapa Flow Demands Definitely Decided as Part of Treaty Transaction.

BERLIN, Friday, December 26 (by the Associated Press).—The entente's last note, demanding the signing of the protocol to the peace treaty, was discussed by the cabinet today in a brief session.

In official circles the note, it is said, is regarded as further evidence that the supreme council is playing politics. Government officials point out what is believed to be a contradiction in the note, which in its introductory sentence refers to the absence of American ratification and subsequently mentions the possibility that the United States may be definitely omitted from the list of ratifying powers.

German Position.
The Berlin government believes reference to these conditions superfluous, inasmuch as it has already indicated it does not propose to construe America's failure to participate as entailing Germany's concessions, especially as the cabinet is fully aware that ratification by three powers is all the sanction needed.

It is evident the government is determined to have the entente demand for indemnity tonnage for German warships sunk at Scapa Flow precisely indicated. To this end the German reply is expected to suggest that a second protocol, definitely establishing the tonnage issue in respect to the nature and volume of equipment to be turned over, be signed simultaneously with the original protocol. Opinion in cabinet circles today was that Germany would be justified in yielding to the entente demand for signing the main protocol only if a parallel document covering the tonnage issue specifically should also be included in the final ratification of the treaty.

Charges Considered Unfounded.
Official quarters expect the arrival of a commission of experts to visit Hantebate and Baltic ports to determine the nature and quantity of harbor and dock equipment at Germany's disposal. Charges that Germany has disposed of a large amount of this material since the entente indicated its intention to requisition it are regarded officially as totally unfounded.

It is also stated that Kurt von Lersner, head of the German delegation at Versailles, and his associates were cut off from all communication with Berlin from Monday until Wednesday afternoon, and that the French foreign office offered the German representatives neither a substitute telephone nor a telegraph service.

COUNCIL HEARS FROM MILITARY CONFEREES
Gets Information as to Results of First Meetings Between German and Allied Experts.

PARIS, December 27.—The supreme council today received information as to the results of the first meetings between German and allied military experts regarding arrangements for the execution of the treaty of Versailles.

It appeared on the first exchange of views that the railroad material offered by the Germans for the transportation of allied troops to districts where plebiscites are to be held was considered insufficient by the allied representatives.

The council also considered the nature of the reply to the Swiss memorandum concerning the entry of Switzerland into the league of nations. The council will reply to the Swiss suggestion that its entry into the league be subject to certain conditions.
