DETECTIVE KILLED
SILVERWARE THIEF

Men on Watch Intercept Robber Who Buried Loot From Glover Home.

Throughout all yesterday and last night detectives had waited for the return of the unidentified burglar. His death was the climax to a watch of about 36 hours.

The form of the burglar attracted attention when he was brushing through the wood shed to reclaim the loot. Allgood was first to sight him.

He called to the man to throw up his hands. The man seized his right hand with a pistol in it. He pointed the weapon at Allgood. A powerful searchlight flashed him from the darkness, surprising him into non-activity. Allgood fired. The burglar was turning and was shot in the back.

As he fell to the ground he cried: "You fellows have paralyzed me."

Retrieved at about 1 o'clock yesterday morning the unidentified burglar visited the Glover residence and carried off silverware.

Policeman Turnbull visited the home, examined the premises and discovered footprints in the soft mud and snow. Accompanied by Mr. Glover and one of his employees the three detectives tracked the footprints in a southerly direction, toward the river.

Once the trail was lost, the searchers spread in the impression of a silver pitcher in the soft earth. They regained the trail and soon found the hidden cache of silverware.
