### ALLEGED MARKED CARDS USED IN POKER GAME

Claimed That \$350,000 Was Involved—New York Manufacturer Accused.

NEW YORK, March 11.—Justice Kernochan yesterday issued a warrant for the arrest of Louis Krohnberg, president of the Bijou Waist Company, on a charge of obtaining money under false pretenses in connection with a stud poker game alleged to have been played at his home in December. During a hearing in February Jacob Silverman testified that marked cards were used in the game. The hearing grew out of a complaint by Assistant District Attorney Thomas A. McInerath that approximately \$350,000 was involved in a series of poker games at Krohnberg's home in West End avenue, the home of Joseph Schneck, a motion picture producer, at the McAlpin Hotel and at the Wave Crest Manor Hotel, at Arverne, Long Island. Silverman testified that he lost \$7,300 in a game at Krohnberg's home. When Krohnberg was told that a warrant had been issued for his arrest he surrendered himself. A surety company put up the \$1,000 bail fixed for him. He pleaded not guilty and his hearing was set for Saturday.

### ALLIES TO BE FIRM IN NOTE TO GERMANY

To Demand Immediate Application of Penalties Promised in Baltic Outrages.

PARIS, March 11.—The conference of ambassadors today decided to send the German government a very firmly worded note demanding immediate application of the penalties promised for the outrages suffered by officers of the interallied commission in the Baltic states during the German evacuation of this region which has hitherto been delayed. At the demand of the British delegation the conference has decided to demand again that the government at Bergrade order the evacuation of Radobuz, thirty-seven miles east of Gratz, which is still occupied by the Yugoslavs, contrary to the decisions of the conference. The conference has sent precise instructions to the commissions of control in Germany, as the German government has contested their right to visit fortresses which are not to be destroyed. The control commissions were meant to have the right to visit all German fortified places.

### LITTLE CRIME IN IRELAND, DR. J. A. H. IRWIN SAYS

Pastor of Killead Church Will Tour America in Behalf of Home Rule.

"There is not a country which is more free from crime today than Ireland. There is not a country other than Ireland in which I would feel safe in allowing my wife to travel alone. Despite the fact that factories for crime—guerrilla warfare, etc.—are great in Ireland, there is more crime committed in London in one week than in Ireland in one month. This statement was made today by Rev. Dr. J. A. H. Irwin, pastor of the Presbyterian Church at Killead, near Belfast. Dr. Irwin is in this country to give "voluntarily" his services to stimulate interest in behalf of Irish independence. He will shortly make a tour of the United States to reply to charges made by a delegation of Irish clergymen who recently visited this country in opposition to Sinn Feinism. He arrived in Washington several days ago. Dr. Irwin's statement on crime in Ireland was brought out when he was asked to comment on the recent attempt to assassinate Lord French in Dublin. He said that had not the body of a Sinn Feiner been discovered near the site of the attempted murder, he would have thought the affair had been "worked up" by British authorities. "There are a lot of hot-bloods among the younger element, who believe in radical measures," Dr. Irwin said. "The older and more conservative Irish frown upon demonstrations of this kind. But it is a wonder to me that there are not more attempts upon the lives of officials. The country is peculiarly adapted to guerrilla warfare. But unless the military or police take drastic action, they are not molested." Ireland today resembles an armed camp, he continued. Armored cars and tanks rumble through the country to "intimidate" the people. Dr. Irwin denied that the Irish question was a religious one; it is purely an economic and political question, he averred.

### NEW HAMPSHIRE "BLAZES LEONARD WOOD TRAIL"

"New Hampshire has blazed the trail," the Senator Governor H. H. Chase commented today on the presidential preference primary in New Hampshire, whereby the delegates pledged to vote for Leonard Wood at the republican convention in Chicago declared those who ran on an unpledged ticket by a vote of about two to one. "She has made it clear through the voice of her republican voters," said Governor Chase, "that she believes that there must be no loophole left through which any one could seek to put over the nomination of another man than Leonard Wood. The fact that the only issue in New Hampshire was whether or not the state delegation should go to Chicago pledged to Wood or unpledged indicated the temper of her people, for the able men who ran unpledged were loyal supporters of Leonard Wood."

### Palmer Speaks Before Chamber at Richmond

RICHMOND, Va., March 11.—Radicals unchecked would go a long way toward utterly destroying the plans and purposes for which the American government was founded, Attorney General Palmer declared last night in an address to the Richmond Chamber of Commerce. "But I would not have you believe that the republic is in danger," he added. So-called revolutionists, the Attorney General said, will never make such headway as they may hope to overturn a government so firmly established in the hearts of the people as the American government. He warned, however, that unless halted they may "create such serious disturbances that will make life in our beloved country much less comfortable than it is now." Tracing the history of radicalism, the Attorney General said there always had been a sprinkling of anarchists in America, but that before the war the leaders believing in no form of government were few in number.

### War Brought Agitators

"But the war brought many agitators to our shores with the purpose of transplanting here the chaotic condition of unhappy Russia," he said, pointing out that this called for enactment of adequate laws to protect the nation from attacks within. While education will help solve the problem, Mr. Palmer said settlement of the labor question was fundamental to the solution, adding: "We cannot deny that the time has come when labor is entitled to a larger proportion of the wealth which labor, in combination with money, produces." "I am strong for reducing the high cost of living," the Attorney General said, "but I have no hope of doing it by ever to get to a lower level. All I want wages reduced and I do not think it would be wise or proper for us ever to get to a lower level. All my political life I have been fighting for labor. I was a strike leader once."

### Cleveland's Mayor Will Resign

CLEVELAND, Ohio, March 11.—Harry L. Davis, serving his third term as mayor of Cleveland, announced last night that he will resign "within the next few weeks" so that he can devote his entire time to his candidacy for Governor of Ohio, William S. Fitz Gerald, director of law, automatically would become mayor.

### CANDIDACY NOT CERTAIN

Roosevelt Makes Announcement on New York Senatorial Race. Franklin D. Roosevelt, assistant secretary of the Navy, says it all depends on circumstances whether or not he will be a senatorial candidate from New York. "The question of whether or not I shall be a candidate for United States senator for New York," he said, "is contingent on so many things that I feel that I will not state positively whether I will or will not be a candidate. However, I most distinctly do not wish to state that I will not be a candidate."

The Cuban minister to France deposited at the French ministry of foreign affairs Tuesday the peace treaty protocol with Germany as ratified by Cuba.

### SEEKS AID OF CHURCHES TO COMBAT LIVING COST

Department of Justice Asks Pastors to Build Up Constructive Patriotism. About fifty clergymen representing various denominations conferred this afternoon with Howard E. Figg, special assistant attorney general; Miss Edith Strauss and Mrs. William B. Chamberlain, at the Department of Justice, regarding a campaign to reduce the cost of living in the District.

It is likely local committees of clergymen will be appointed to cooperate with the Department of Justice in its efforts to bring down living costs in the District. In his talk, Mr. Figg urged the clergymen to build up in their parishes and congregations now a constructive patriotism to combat destructive political and economic forces at work as powerful and vicious and useful to the nation as the destructive patriotism that was built up with the aid of the churches to combat our enemies in the world war.
