

RECOUNT IS TO BE ASKED BY JOHNSON OF JERSEY VOTE

Harding's Manager in Ohio Is Beaten for Delegate at Large.

By the Associated Press. NEWARK, N. J., April 30.—Formal application for a recount of the vote in New Jersey's presidential preferential primary last Tuesday may be made here late today, according to supporters of Senator Hiram W. Johnson of California who, on the face of unofficial returns from all four districts was defeated by Maj. Gen. Leonard Wood by 1,297 votes.

Wood gains in Camden County. CAMDEN, N. J., April 30.—The official count of the vote in Camden county in Tuesday's primary election shows a net gain of five for Wood over the complete unofficial figures as announced election night. The official count, completed, gives Wood 5,882 and Johnson, 1,976, a plurality for Wood of 3,906.

Harding's Manager Loses in Convention Primary

COLUMBUS, Ohio, April 30.—By a margin of but 307 votes, Harry M. Daugherty of Columbus, national campaign manager for Senator Warren G. Harding, was defeated in Tuesday's primary for delegate at large to the republican national convention at Chicago, complete returns from the state showed last night. The returns gave Daugherty 167,373 votes and his rival, William H. Boyd of Cleveland, a Wood delegate, 167,066.

Mr. Daugherty said: "We are satisfied with the results in Ohio and will go to the convention with at least forty-four out of the forty-eight delegates of the state," said Harry M. Daugherty, national campaign manager for Senator Warren G. Harding. He refused to comment on his own contest for a place on Ohio's "big four."

SEATTLE, Wash., April 30.—Upon receipt of messages from republican leaders in the Senate urging his immediate presence in Washington, Senator Miles Poindexter, candidate for the republican presidential nomination, announced he had abandoned a speaking tour he had planned through Oregon and would return immediately to the capital.

INDIANAPOLIS, April 30.—We are satisfied with the results in Ohio and will go to the convention with at least forty-four out of the forty-eight delegates of the state," said Harry M. Daugherty, national campaign manager for Senator Warren G. Harding. He refused to comment on his own contest for a place on Ohio's "big four."

There is a possibility that the official count, to take place here early next week, may change the results in the Daugherty-Boyd contest. The complete returns give Senator Harding a plurality of 18,393 votes over Maj. Gen. Wood for the presidential preference. The vote stands: Harding, 126,581; Wood, 108,188.

NEW SECRETARY IN CABINET WANTED. SPOKANE, Wash., April 30.—Prominent educators will attend the republican and democratic national conventions to present a demand that a plank for a national department of education with a secretary be included in their respective platforms, according to an announcement by Josephine Corlies Preston, president of the National Education Association.

McBride Indicted in Alaska. JUNEAU, Alaska, April 30.—The nomination of John C. McBride, republican candidate for national committeeman of Alaska, in Tuesday's primary was indicated when 70 per cent of the vote had been counted. Thomas J. Donahue was renominated for democratic national committeeman without opposition.

Negro to Run for Governor. LITTLE ROCK, Ark., April 30.—J. H. Blunt, the first negro in the history of Arkansas to claim himself as a candidate for state office, has paid the necessary fee to have his name placed on the ballots as a republican gubernatorial candidate. Blunt was nominated for the office at a meeting of negro republicans who had left the regular state convention when a delegation consisting entirely of whites was seated.

Republicans of the second congressional district in convention at Newport elected Henry C. Wade of Batesville as delegate to the republican national convention. He will go unopposed. "Mad Rowden of Mammoth Springs was nominated as a candidate for congressman.

Negro Seeks House Seat. JEFFERSON CITY, Mo., April 30.—George L. Vaughn, a negro lawyer of St. Louis, has filed a declaration of his candidacy for the republican nomination for Congress from the twelfth (St. Louis) district with the secretary of state. Vaughn is the second negro to announce for the office to succeed L. C. Dyer, incumbent.

Women Delegates Favored. INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., April 30.—The democratic state committee, here yesterday went on record in favor of the selection of woman delegates to the national convention. The action was taken in an open meeting on a motion presented by John W. Holtzman of Indianapolis and seconded by Thomas Taggart, candidate for United States senator.

Gov. Harding to Speak at Denver. DENVER, Col., April 30.—Gov. W. L. Harding of Iowa will deliver the keynote speech at the Colorado state republican convention at Pueblo on Monday. It was announced. The convention will name delegates and alternates to the national convention at Chicago.

Johnson Attacks League. SOUTH BEND, Ind., April 30.—"If I had the power I would carve the heart out of the league of nations by cutting out its arteries," Senator Hiram W. Johnson of California told his audience here last night in a speech in which he attacked the league and the republican presidential nomination.

Senator Johnson declined to make any comment on the New Jersey situation. Senator Johnson attacked the high cost of living, and declared that there are sufficient laws to punish profiteering if the administration at Washington would enforce them. He declared in favor of a national budget system, saying that a discontinuance of needless extravagance at Washington

would materially aid in the fight against the high cost of living. The Californian attacked the press of the country opposed to him in the presidential race.

"WIPE ARMENIA OFF MAP," IS NEW TURKISH ORDER

CONSTANTINOPLE, April 28.—"Let us all join forces and wipe Armenia from the map," is the keynote of an order of the day issued by Kiamsh Bekir Pasha, chief of the nationalists, to the bands concentrating near Erzerum with the object of preventing the Armenians from occupying the city when it is allotted to them by the peace conference.

The order of the day mentions that in accordance with a treaty signed with Mustafa Kemal Pasha the Azerbaijan republic agreed to support the nationalists and fight the Armenians.
