CAMBRIDGE, Mass., July 17.—Athletes from all parts of the country qualified for places on the American Olympic team in the final trials at the Harvard stadium today in a track and field meet the average of which has never been equaled.

Members of the American Olympic committee who will select the team which will represent the United States at Antwerp next month expressed the opinion that the 1920 combination would be the best balanced that ever sailed from these shores.

The Olympic trials, which were combined with the Amateur Athletic Union annual senior championships, attracted more than twenty thousand spectators to the Harvard Stadium.

Although the first four places in each event alone counted in the A. U. championship scores, six men were scored in most of the contests in order to give the Olympic committee a working basis for the selection of the team tomorrow.
