### FIUME DAY CALL ISSUED.

**Friends of Italy in This Country to Observe Anniversary.**  
NEW YORK, August 30.—A call for all "Italians and friends of Italy" to celebrate "Fiume day" on September 12, anniversary of the occupation of Fiume by Gabriele D'Annunzio and his forces, has been issued here by Whitney Warren, newly appointed representative of the D'Annunzio government in the United States.  
"At these meetings," the call read, "resolutions should be passed proclaiming the unalterable determination of all Italians in this country, as well as in Italy itself, that Fiume and Dalmatia shall be reunited to their mother country."

## MEXICAN TROOPS HUNT KIDNAPED AMERICANS

**War Department Orders Search for Pedro Zamora, Bandit, Reported in Flight.**  
MEXICO CITY, August 29 (by the Associated Press).—Search for American and British subjects kidnaped by Pedro Zamora, the Jalisco bandit, during his raid on the town of Cuatle on August 20, has been ordered by the war department. Gen. Rafael Buena, commander of a force of cavalry pursuing the outlaws, continues to follow their trail, and it is declared the bandits are demoralized and in flight.  
Reports received today at the presidential offices from Gen. P. Elias Calles, secretary of war, who has gone to Guadaluajara, say the outlaws who more than thirty killed in the recent fight with government troops at Rancho Divisadero. All women who were kidnaped by the Zamora band in the raid on the town of Autlan August 11 have been liberated, it is stated.  
United States and British consuls at Guadaluajara are ignorant as to the whereabouts of "Sandy" Gardner, an American, and W. J. Johnson, a British subject, who were kidnaped by Pedro Zamora at Cuale on August 20. Press dispatches received from that city state the consuls believe the two men could easily have escaped during the recent fight between Zamora's band and government troops.  
Zamora is fleeing and is reported to be in the vicinity of Zenonville, near Jalisco, with a few followers. Soledad Gomez, a girl who was kidnaped by Zamora during the attack upon the town of Autlan, has been ransomed by relatives.

## TOKIO MINISTER WILL NOT BETRAY ANFU FUGITIVES

PEKING, August 30.—The Japanese legation here, replying today to the request of the Chinese foreign office for the extradition of members of the Anfu, or military group, who have taken refuge in the Japanese legation, refuses to surrender the men. The Japanese note says in part:  
"I have the honor to reply that in view of the fact that the presidential mandate seeking the arrest of the individuals in question was issued on political grounds, and the legation is giving them refuge as political offenders, I shall not be in a position to comply with the request for extradition, irrespective of any criminal offenses with which the men may be charged."  
The Chinese note to the Japanese legation said that evidence of the crimes of the offenders would be communicated to the Japanese minister after due investigation at the departments concerned, after which formal extradition would be requested. The Chinese communication said the government hoped that meantime the offenders would neither be released into nor removed elsewhere for concealment.  
Though small in area, the British island of Mauritius produced about 300,000 tons of sugar last year.

## COMES TO RESIDE HERE.

**Lieut. Col. Bicknell Last of Original Business Men Serving in Paris**  
PARIS, August 28.—Lieut. Col. Ernest P. Bicknell, who recently resigned as deputy commissioner in Europe for the American Red Cross, sailed today with his family for Washington, where he plans to reside.  
He is the last to leave France of the original group of seventeen prominent business men who arrived in the spring of 1917 to begin organization work for the American Red Cross.  
Col. Bicknell's home formerly was in Chicago.
