Speaker Makes Appeal for Harding and Coolidge at Republican Rally.

Declaring this presidential campaign to be the most righteous and most momentous one since the civil war, Edgar C. Snyder of Nebraska, chairman of the speakers' bureau of the local campaign committee, made an earnest appeal for the election of Harding and Coolidge during an address last night before a gathering of republicans at the H street campaign headquarters.

Henry M. Camp, chairman of the local campaign committee, presided.

BORAH FLAYS COVENANT IN MANCHESTER SPEECH

Senator Refers to Controversy Between President and Spencer.

MANCHESTER, N. H., October 14.—President Wilson in a speech at the peace conference, already a subject of widely published controversy between him and Senator Spencer of Missouri, declared that "if any covenants of this settlement are not observed the United States will send her armies and navies to see that they are observed." Senator Borah of Idaho asserted in an address here last night.

OLD DOCTRINES' FATE AT STAKE, SAYS LODGE

I., October 14, (by the Associated Press).—The question which the people will settle at the coming election is whether they are prepared to reject the great doctrines of Monroe and the American principles of Washington and become a part of the European system, said Senator Lodge at a republican meeting here last night.

HARDING'S NEW YORK TRIP

Will End at Rochester, It Is Announced—Root to Speak.

NEW YORK, October 14.—Senator Harding will come no farther east than Rochester, N. Y., during his New York trip, it was announced today.
