





DEBS HELPS PLAN TO PUSH RELEASE

Campaign for Nation-Wide
Petition to Relinquish All
Political Prisoners.

CHICAGO, March 31.—The energetic
campaign of the socialist party to se-
cure the unconditional release of Eugene
V. Debs and all other political prisoners
was sealed with approval by Eugene V.
Debs himself in a recent interview with
Otto Branstetter, national executive
secretary of the socialist party, in a re-
ception room of the Atlanta penitentiary.
Branstetter was the first outsider to see
and speak with Debs since the revoca-
tion of prison privileges by the Wilson
administration.

The plans for a nation-wide petition,
to be presented to Congress April 13 and
14, the second anniversary of the lock-
ing up of Debs, the visit of numerous
delegations from a large number of
cities to Washington on those days,
who will seek to interview Attorney
General Daugherty and President Har-
ding, and all other means to get the at-
tention of the American people upon the
matter of amnesty were discussed by
Debs and fully approved, according to
Mr. Branstetter.

"Upon one matter alone, that of pick-
eting the White House immediately, was
there some question, and upon Debs'
suggestion it was decided to hold the
matter of picketing in abeyance. The
motto adopted for the amnesty drive is
"Let's get them all out."
Mr. Branstetter said that Mr. Debs
looks well, and is in excellent health
and good spirits.

"Gene was never in the 'hole,'" said
the socialist executive, "nor did he
suffer any personal mistreatment."
Speaking of the matter of the cam-
paign, Secretary Branstetter said that
they are going to deny the right of
picketing are being vigorously pushed,
and they will not be changed on
account of the criticism that they are
intending to initiate.


"We expect the new administration
to be reactionary in many particu-
lars," said Branstetter, speaking for
himself, his committee and for Debs;
"we expect that it will impose many
just demands of the organized work-
ers, and the wishes of the people
generally, but we do not believe that
they are going to deny the right of
petition or to consider it, as did the
Wilson entourage, insulting and pre-
sumptuous, on the part of any group
of citizens to make their wishes
known."

"Amnesty committees are being or-
ganized in every part of the country,
and it is certain that the delegations
that will come to Washington will
number many thousands, from scores
of cities."
