**'EMPLOYER GREED' HIT BY GOMPERS**  
Warns Against Putting American Labor "to Too Severe a Test."

CINCINNATI, Ohio, May 10.—The greedy horde of employers in the United States had better watch out, President Samuel Gompers of the American Federation of Labor warned in an address here last night at a labor mass meeting.

"I most earnestly desire to impress," he said, "on those who have undertaken to destroy the American labor movement—don't put American manhood and womanhood to too severe a test."

"You seem to have the upper hand now, but remember the pendulum doesn't always swing one way. I respectfully suggest thoughtful consideration of the unwisdom of driving your bargain too hard."

Wage cutting is "simply reducing the using and consuming power of the people," declared the labor leader, adding:

"No country has ever gained prosperity industrially, financially or commercially—based on the poverty and misery of the people."

Mr. Chamber of Commerce Man and other opponents of organized labor," continued Mr. Gompers, "should heed the lesson now going on over the whole world."

**Stresses Labor's Patriotism.**  
"The American labor movement is the only labor movement of any country on the civilized globe where the organized workers have not their hand on the throat of their government. We have our organized bodies and are conscientious of our responsibilities that rest upon us. We are not lacking in patriotic zeal for our republic."

"I challenge the United States Chamber of Commerce, Mr. Gary or the steel trust to open their books to public inspection as the American Federation of Labor is willing to do."

"The workers will not tolerate any movement that undertakes to drive them back, so again they are typified as the man with the hoe. We are men and women, and servants. We are free citizens of the United States and stand erect, looking the whole world in the face and demanding justice and will be content with nothing less."

Protesting against wage cutting, Mr. Gompers said: "High wages, the best possible wages, the best possible hours and working conditions are the greatest incentives to industrial, commercial and financial prosperity."

"The industry that cannot offer to pay good decent wages to its workers ought not to exist."

"If low wages and long hours of employment seriously injure industrial prosperity, China ought to be at the head of civilization."

**Sees "Open Shop" Failure.**  
President Gompers declared that the "open shop" movement in Cincinnati, as well as in other sections of the United States, would fail. He said the promoters of the movement were inspired by "avarice and greed."

Frank Morrison, secretary of the federation, declared that the National Manufacturers Association, the Iron Erectors' League, the Associated Industries and other employers' associations have organized a "great conspiracy" to destroy the organized labor movement.

"This organized effort," he declared, "has expended at least millions of dollars in publishing in various papers of the country advertising denouncing organized labor. There seems to be no length to which this aggregation will not go."

**Jane Addams to Preside at Peace Congress of Women in Vienna**

VIENNA, May 10.—Members of the third international congress of the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom have arranged to import their own breadstuffs during the meeting of the congress here July 10 to 18. Jane Addams of Hull House, Chicago, will preside.

While the agenda for the congress has not been perfected, the topics selected include "Education as the Way to Peace," "Efforts Against Hatred and War Passion," "Women in International Affairs," "Question of Pledge of Personal Refusal to Support Any War by Money, Work or Propaganda," "Freedom of Trade, Transit and Communications" and similar subjects.

The congress will be followed by the international conference at which education for internationalism will be undertaken.

**Seven Killed at Political Rally.**  
ROME.—Seven persons were killed and eleven were injured in a fight between nationalists and socialists at a meeting held in Palermo, Sicily, Sunday. The encounter occurred at a political meeting. Elsewhere in Italy meetings held in connection with the electoral campaign now in progress were marked by only a few minor disorders.

**Belgium Joins League Court.**  
GENEVA.—Belgium has adhered to the international court of the league of nations, the Belgian minister to Switzerland, F. Peltzer, signing the document. Belgium is the thirty-third signatory.

**Made Marshal of France.**  
PARIS.—Gen. Gallieni, former minister of war and former military governor of Paris, who died in 1916, has been posthumously named a marshal of France in a decree signed by President Millerand. This was in accordance with authorization given by parliament last month.

RIGA.—The Russian soviet government, which for a long time has appeared inclined to revert to the German name, St. Petersburg, for the former capital, reversing the wartime edict changing the name to Petrograd, has decided to keep the name.

SAN JOSE, Costa Rica.—Discovery of valuable oil and gas territory near Puerto Limon, on the eastern coast of Costa Rica, is reported here. Natul gas is escaping from the earth in large quantities at Cahuita, and one well from which gas was issuing has become the scene of a serious fire.

**Mail Airplane Pilot Burned.**  
ALICANTE, Spain.—An airplane carrying mails between Toulon, France, and Rabat, Morocco, fell into the bay here in flames just after having delivered a sack of letters. The pilot was burned to death.

**State's Death Accidental.**  
ROME.—Investigation of the circumstances surrounding the death of Francesco Tedesco former minister of finance, whose body was found beneath the window of his apartment, is said to indicate that his fall from a window was due to an accident. The former minister had been suffering from heart trouble, and during a severe attack had leaned out of his window to get some air. It is declared he lost his balance and fell.


