**HAYNES EXONERATES AGENT WHO MADE RAID**  
 Prohibition Commissioner Haynes has exonerated E. B. Hensen, a special agent of charges of making a raid in Savannah upon a residence without a warrant. It was announced today at prohibition headquarters.  
 Agent Hensen's report, officials said, disclosed that the raiding party had a warrant for a house near the residence of Miss Bessie Gaden. The party, officials said, planned to make their entrance from an alley, and through confusion in the back doors got into Miss Gaden's residence by mistake.  
 Commissioner Haynes, officials said, has taken the position that Agent Hensen, who intended no violation of the law, had procured a warrant for a proper search and that the entrance to Miss Gaden's residence was due entirely to error and that there was no reason for action in the case by headquarters.  
 All field prohibition agents have been instructed by Commissioner Haynes, officials declared, to exercise the greatest care in making searches. It was added that no malicious raids upon persons' homes would be tolerated by the prohibition unit. However, officials asserted, where the prohibition agent had exercised every care to comply with the law, but had been misled by the peculiar situation of the houses, as in Savannah, there could be no blame attached to his procedure.  
 The action of Agent Hensen was made the subject of a protest by Mayor Stewart of Savannah to President Harding and Senators Harris and Watson of Georgia.

**ARLINGTON COUNTY.**  
 The bureau of schools of the Arlington County Chamber of Commerce has called a mass meeting for tomorrow evening at the courthouse for the purpose of explaining to the citizens of the county its proposal to provide improved school facilities for Arlington and Washington districts. The proposal involves the question of floating a bond issue of \$500,000 which it is thought necessary to put the educational system of these two districts on an adequate basis. This meeting had been previously announced in other papers to be held this evening at the courthouse.  
 The first annual ladies' night of Arlington Lodge of Odd Fellows is announced for next Friday at Ives Hall, Clarendon. This affair will also be in the nature of recognition of the excellent work of officers of the new and growing organization which numbers 297 members. Rev. E. W. Mellichampe of the Public Church is to be one of the principal speakers and there will be a short musical program. Due to the limited space in the meeting hall, invitations are limited to the members and families.

**HEADS NEW DEPARTMENT.**  
 NASHVILLE, Tenn., November 28.—The Nashville, Chattanooga and St. Louis railway today announced the appointment of Henry S. Henry, Nashville lawyer and former newspaperman, as associate counsel and director of a newly created department of public relations.

**Airmen's Lighthouse on Mount to Throw Its Beams 200 Miles**  
 PARIS, November 10.—What is described as the most powerful lighthouse ever constructed has just been completed here. It is intended for the new air station at Dijon and has taken over two years to construct.  
 The beam of light thrown from two groups of lamps has an intensity of 2,000,000,000 candlepower and the flash will be seen at a distance of nearly 200 miles.  
 The whole fabric of steel girders on concrete piles will be transported to Mount Airciel 1,500 feet, nine miles from Dijon, where it will be set up permanently as a guiding light for the great airways to the east and south of Europe.  
 Its cost to the air company which ordered it is estimated at 800,000 francs.

**AMERICAN LEGION ASKS OREGON TO MEET FOCH**  
 Work of Gen. Angeles for France Held to Make Meeting Especially Appropriate.

 SAN ANTONIO, Tex., November 28.—President Obregon of Mexico has been invited by the American Legion of Texas to meet Marshal Ferdinand Foch when the allied leader visits San Antonio December 7. Wayne Davis, state commander, wired the invitation to Mexico City.  
 The meeting is, especially appropriate, the legion officials point out, because the French "seventy-five," the gun which in the generalissimo's own words, "won the war," was developed by a close military ally and friend of President Obregon, the late general Felipe Angeles of Mexico. Angeles, later killed by Carranza edict, was inspector of munitions in the French army, wore the highest military decoration of France, that of the Legion of Honor, in recognition of his services to the allied cause.

**GRANTED OIL RIGHTS.**  
 Standard Oil Said to Have Secured Concessions in Northern Persia.  
 LONDON, November 27.—A dispatch to the London Times from Basra, Asiatic Turkey, dated Friday, says the Times of Mesopotamia understands from a reliable source that oil concessions in northern Persia have been granted to the Standard Oil Company for fifty years. The newspaper adds that it is reported the Persian government will receive 12 per cent of the gross profits.

**FOCH TO BE CHIEF OF CROW INDIAN TRIBE**  
 Ceremony of Induction at the Agency, Near Billings, Mont., This Afternoon.  
 BILLINGS, Mont., November 28.—Marshal Foch will be made a chief of the Crow Indian tribe today at the agency near here. The marshal's special train arrived here early this morning and after a brief stop was switched to Crow agency, south of here.  
 The Foch party will first visit the Custer battlefield, where the scene of the battle of the Little Big Horn in 1876 will be viewed. Then will follow the induction of the French soldier-as a chief of the Crow Indians. Several hundred members of the tribe will participate in the ceremonies, which will be in charge of Chief Plenty Coups of the Crows.  
 On the return trip a brief stop will be made at Billings shortly after noon. En route to Butte a brief stop also will be made at Bozeman. From Butte the special train will proceed to St. Marie, Idaho, which will be reached Tuesday, and thence to Spokane, Wash.

**NEGRO PASTOR SHOT DEAD.**  
 MACON, Ga., November 28.—Rev. Dan Ferguson, sixty-year-old negro preacher and land owner, was shot to death near here. The sheriff of Houston county arrested Henry Henson, crippled, twenty-five-year-old negro, on a charge of murder in connection with the shooting.
