**PLANS OF ARCHDEACONRY. INTENSIVE CAMPAIGN TO OPEN TOMORROW**  
 Decision Is Reached to Hold Two Meetings a Year.  
 At a meeting of the archdeaconry of the Episcopal diocese of Washington this week a committee was appointed to prepare plans by which the archdeaconry will be more of a factor in diocesan affairs. The national-wide campaign which the Episcopal Church has conducted in this diocese, as well as throughout the country, during the past three years has taken over largely the former functions of the archdeaconry. It is tentatively arranged to hold two meetings of the archdeaconry a year, at which subjects of a miscellaneous character will be taken up. It is anticipated that the plans of the committee will include an enlargement of the membership of the archdeaconry.
