HORSE RACING GETS BLOW IN MARYLAND

Decisive Vote for Measure Which Rejects State Revenue of \$700,000.

ANNAPOLIS, March 2.—There is general bewilderment at Annapolis over the action of the Maryland legislature in passing in such overwhelming fashion the bill which dissolves the connection between the state government and race track gambling and in consequence, knocks to pieces the whole scheme upon which Gov. Ritchie based the financial side of his extensive schemes for public improvements.

There has been a general tendency to treat as out of the question the proposition that Maryland would forego \$700,000 a year in revenue, but when the house of delegates adopted the bill against racing, which carried this financial sacrifice with it, and took this action by a 3-to-1 vote, both the friends of the track and the supporters of Gov. Ritchie's administration were swept from their feet.

Friends of Tracks Dazed.
At present the friends of the tracks are barely able to look about them, and have not yet formulated a plan to continue their existence.

Support From Baltimore.
The most surprising thing about the vote was that the bill received the support of about half the members from Baltimore city, all whom, except Hall, had been listed against the bill, and of many of the delegates from counties which contain tracks. Among these are to be mentioned the five delegates from Anne Arundel, in which is situated the Laurel track, the most productive in funds in the state, all of whom voted against the bill.
