

NEW PARKING RULES FOR AGENCIES

Motorists Adjusting Themselves to Regulations Aimed to Relieve Congestion.

Motorists are endeavoring today to adjust themselves to the new parking regulations, which became effective this morning in the congested section.

The former congested area extended from 7th to 17th street and from the south side of Pennsylvania avenue to K street.

Under the new rules there are only two parking limits in the congested section—thirty minutes and one hour.

Two-Hour Parking Places. Here are the places where two-hour parking is allowed in the congested area.

Must Keep Away From Corners. Next to parking time, the most important new regulation is that which prohibits parking in the congested section on vehicle shall park within twenty feet of a corner.

Ten Feet From Fire Hydrants. Another important section of the new regulation is that which prohibits a vehicle shall park within ten feet of a fire hydrant.



NOTABLES FLEE AS FIRE WRECKS TOP OF WILLARD

Ballrooms and Roof Destroyed in \$250,000 Blaze—Whole Hotel Drenched—Guests Leave Quietly and No One Is Hurt.

Scores of guests at the New Willard Hotel, many of national and international prominence, were called hurriedly to their rooms shortly before 6 o'clock yesterday morning.

Flames leaped out of every window on the top floor and dense black smoke poured out of the building.

Apparently the blaze had been burning for some time before it was discovered, for within a few moments after Policeman Caldwell discovered the smoke pouring from the windows.

Gradually the firemen worked their way into the two rooms, throwing buckets of water as they went.

While the firemen were fighting the blaze the guests were hurrying out of their rooms in answer to the telephone calls and banging on their doors.

Several meetings which were scheduled to be held in the ballrooms this week have been taken care of elsewhere.

While the elevators were kept running for some time after the blaze was discovered, it was not possible to use them after the firemen got to work, as their shafts became clogged.
