FRIENDSHIP HOUSE NEEDS MEMBERS

Home Has Outgrown Quarters and Finds Efforts Face Handicap.

Friendship House, the social settlement and day home at 326 Virginia avenue southeast, needs a larger membership to support the work which has steadily been growing in usefulness for twenty-one years. It has now outgrown its quarters, its cramped and handicapped and finds its equipment inadequate to meet the community's growing demands.

Faced with this situation, those interested in the work of the house will meet at the Central Y. M. C. A., 1736 G street northwest, on Friday afternoon, May 4, at 1:30 o'clock, to discuss ways and means to increase the membership. William Knowles Cooper, secretary of the Y. M. C. A.; E. L. Stock, governor of the fifth district of Rotary Clubs, and Miss Lydia Burklin, head resident of the settlement, will speak. No money will be solicited. It is announced.

The work of the house has been to maintain a day home; to conduct social and educational clubs and classes; to plan summer outings and sightseeing trips for young and old; to provide quarters for a public library station and a meeting place for girl and boy scouts and to act as a neighborhood employment agency and general information bureau.

In addition to this, the aims of Friendship House have been to study the needs of the neighborhood and meet these needs; to co-operate with all of the social agencies in improving the life of the community; to cultivate a neighborhood spirit; to stimulate interest in education. The settlement has been endorsed by the charities endorsement committee and is a member of the Washington Council of Social Agencies. Henry P. Blair is its president. The classes of membership are: Sustaining membership, \$25; contributing, \$10; associate, \$5; and annual, \$1. Checks should be made payable to Friendship House Association, 326 Virginia avenue southeast.
