## FEDERAL ECONOMY PLANS SUBMITTED

President Harding and Officials Meet to Discuss Financial Policies.

Policies for economies, originating within the administrative branch of the government rather than being forced by Congress, and simplification of the budget system—which are expected to wipe out a prospective deficit of \$600,000,000 for the fiscal year 1924 and place the federal government on a strictly cash basis—are expected to be urged by President Harding and Director of the Budget Lord at the third annual business meeting of the government officials today.

These economies of administration, forestalling the avowed purpose of Congress to hold the government establishments down strictly to the estimated revenues, are pressed as the only alternative for increased taxes, which it is generally admitted the people would resent.

### Gen. Lord Makes Report.

The federal officials were called into the economy conference by President Harding to hear the report of the new budget officer, Brig. Gen. Herbert M. Lord, for the fiscal year just closed, balanced against which are the estimated revenues and appropriations for the current fiscal year and the prospective financial statistics for the fiscal year 1924, for which the budget must soon be made up. President Harding and Budget Director Lord are prepared to make their recommendations for economies to wipe out the impending deficit so as to maintain this government on a cash basis.

Vice President Coolidge, members of the cabinet and the high officials of all the government departments and independent establishments are gathered together in the National Museum to hear these reports and to get their orders direct from the chief executive that they must co-operate with the administrative branch to hold expenditures down strictly to what is absolutely required under existing law.

### New Budget to Be Drafted.

This conference is preliminary to the drafting of the new budget for the fiscal year 1924, which will be the first budget without "hangovers" from the past unscientific fiscal practice, and in which the great value of the budget system is expected to be shown in economies which originate within the government work itself and in a strict adherence to the expenditures authorized by law. Gen. Lord was to present the revised estimates of the budget bureau for the current year and estimates for the fiscal year 1924, and to discuss the government's economy program.

The third business meeting of the government was expected to lack the significance of the second assembly last January, when Brig. Gen. Dawes, the first director of the budget, clutched a Navy broom in each hand, swept the meeting with a burst of economy oratory.

## ATTACKS ON COMMITTEE LAID TO PROPAGANDA

Director Collier of U. S. Commission to Brazil Exposition Explains Difficulties.

Members of the American commission to the Brazilian international centennial exposition, which opens on September 7 at Rio, declared today that "malicious propaganda" hindered the commission's activities and was responsible for constantly recurring reports that President Harding plans sweeping changes in the personnel of the commission.

Since the President accepted the resignation of Frank A. Harrison as resident commissioner of the commission, at the request of Director General Collier and his associates of the commission, the Department of State has been investigating the charges filed against the commission by Mr. Harrison. Mr. Harrison whose removal was requested because of alleged inharmonious relationship with other members of the commission, was said today to be in California.

Mr. Collier explained that he had no intention of resigning, as director general of the commission, nor was any other member of that body in a mood to relinquish office. Various charges and innuendoes issued from time to time directed at the commission, he said, were baseless and were the work of some influence which sought to retard the progress of the commission was making in connection with the perfection of plans for the American exhibit at the exposition.

There was no intimation at the White House that a report had been received from the State Department concerning its investigation of the affairs of the commission, nor was there any indication that the President contemplated any effort looking to the removal of any member of the commission.
