WAR FRAUD CASES TO BE SPEEDED

Dye Patent Probe Not to Sidetrack Other Investigations.

Investigation by the special federal war frauds grand jury of the sale of hundreds of German dye patents by the alien property custodian in 1919 to the Chemical Foundation, Inc., is expected to be carried on concurrently with other important cases already taken up by the grand jury.

The dye patent sale case, which was opened yesterday with the appearance of Francis P. Garvan, custodian when the sale was consummated, and now president of the purchasing company, was declared authoritative by the first step in a sweeping inquiry into the entire history of the custodian's office since its inception.

Mr. Garvan, refusing to open the records of the company to Assistant Attorney General Cram, as representative of the Department of Justice, said he had offered the entire record to the grand jury. His charge that "German influence" was behind the move to force return of the patents to the government brought a formal denial from Attorney General Daugherty and statement of the American interest in those holdings would be protected.

Lumber Case Soon.

The government was said today practically to have completed presentation of the lumber case to the grand jury, whose findings were expected within a few days. The so-called "Old Hickory" case, followed by the aviation contracts cases, will be presented, according to present plans, soon as the lumber case is out of the way. As a means of expediting work of the war frauds investigation, these cases will be interspersed with the Chemical Foundation and then other alien property matters, it was said.

The government's present program was said to contemplate occupation of the grand jury through July and August with the "Old Hickory" aviation and Chemical Foundation cases, and then to proceed with the other alien property cases until the life of the present grand jury expires in October.

Determination to investigate all acts of the alien property custodian's office was said to have been reached last week, and after the President's action was taken ordering Custodian Miller to proceed against the Chemical Foundation for the return of the former enemy property.

This decision was said to have been actuated by a desire on the part of the administration to have "not only a qualified body—a grand jury—pass on the subject of alien property, as the best means of staying the attack which has been a point of attack from Congress, the press and public."

No indictments urged.

The grand jury investigation does not mean, it was emphasized, that the Department of Justice has been convinced itself that fraud or criminality has been disclosed. No indictments will be asked of officials high in the last administration or others unless the grand jury is convinced beyond a doubt that indictments are warranted, and the department is convinced that conviction might reasonably be expected, administration officials said.

The entire question was said to be "up to the grand jury," and officials declared they hoped that "for the sake of the country's honor" no occasion would be found for any indictments which might hamper not only officials of the last administration, but the government itself.

It was also emphasized that it was entirely possible acts of the alien property custodian with reference to former enemy property might have gone beyond the law without being necessarily criminal, but rather a mistaken judgment concerning authority and the stress of wartime conditions. Return of the property to the present custodian, it was said, would assure protection of American interests and those of the Germans as well.

Christening of New Phone Exchange Found Difficult

Have you ever seen a proud father and mother scanning the pages of the family album for an illustrious uncle or aunt after whom to name their fifth baby boy or girl?

If you have, you can appreciate the problem facing officials of the Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company today.

They are about to establish another exchange in Washington to keep pace with the demand for telephone service, and they are discovering that, after all, the christening of a new crop of switchboards is not so easy as it would seem.

The new exchange is to provide for growth in the north area, but it cannot be placed under the name of North, because that exchange already has as many numbers as the operators can handle efficiently.

Some of the existing exchanges are named after former Presidents, and the company is considering this source from which to draw the name of the new office. The first test to which a name is subjected is, "How will it sound over the wire?" This test, it is understood, has caused the elimination of the names of a number of ex-Presidents. A name that is difficult to enunciate or that might be confused with the designation of an existing exchange cannot be considered.

The company is now testing out scores of names, by giving them to operators over the telephone many times and keeping a record of those which the girls catch without difficulty. If the operators mistake a name given for one of similar sound, that name is eliminated.

One officer of the company is said to be in favor of giving new exchanges names that will identify themselves immediately with the neighborhoods in which the central offices are located.

CHILE-PERU PARLEY NEAR AGREEMENT

Draft of Tacna-Arica Arbitration Protocol May Be Ready Tomorrow.

The Chilean-Peruvian conference made such progress today in drafting finally the Tacna-Arica arbitration settlement that the delegation announced afterward that they expected to conclude this work tomorrow.

An official communique issued when the conference adjourned after a session of more than an hour said: "The discussion relative to the terms of the agreement, which was resumed today, appears to satisfactorily that it is expected these may be concluded tomorrow."

It was indicated that as soon as the arbitration protocol and its supplement agreement were in final form, they would be delivered to Santiago and Lima and a wait of a day or two would be necessary before the document finally could be signed.

The plans of conference leaders were to hold daily sessions until the protocol and its supplement, which is to embody the specific points of arbitration, have been completed finally. A public session in which these instruments are to be signed probably will be arranged when both sides have indicated they are ready for the conference to adjourn sine die.
