A. F. L. REFUSES TO JOIN IN ANTI-WAR PARLEY

Declares It Cannot Commit Itself to International Trades Union "Radical" Intentions.

The American Federation of Labor yesterday formally declined an invitation to participate with the International Federation of Trades Unions in a general anti-war conference of labor representatives at The Hague December 10, declaring its unwillingness to accept in advance several radical principles laid down by the European workers' unions at their congress in Rome recently. In a letter addressed to the British labor organizations the American Federation of Labor asserted that it would not become a party to any congress which asked it to commit itself in advance to such principles as joining an international strike in the event of a war, even though the conflict might be for defense, renouncing national entity or to seek "nationalization of wealth." The American workers had thought, the letter continued, that they might

Join with the foreign unions in a general peace conference, devoted to all ways has been to such a cause. But the American Federation could not, it declared, seek to further such a cause in a meeting "committed in advance to proposals not only lacking in constructive character, but which may easily be of themselves a most serious menace to the cause of freedom." The letter was signed by President Gompers, the eight vice presidents of the federation and its secretary, Frank Morrison. An identical copy of which was forwarded to the British Trades Union Congress and J. H. Thomas, president of the International Federation of Trades Unions.


