

NICHOLAS VOTED CZAR'S SUCCESSOR Supreme Council of Russian Monarchists Meets Secretly in Paris.

By the Associated Press. PARIS, November 23.—The Supreme Council of Russian Monarchists, representing all that is left of the movement in favor of the return of the czarism in Russia, has just completed a five-day secret session in Paris, during which Grand Duke Nicholas, former commander-in-chief of the Russian army, was elected successor to the throne of the late Czar Nicholas.



NICHOLAS. Sixty prominent Russians, including Grand Dukes Cyril, Nicholas, Dmitri and Alexander, attended the meeting, coming from all parts of Europe for the purpose. The council was held sooner than expected because of the recent announcement by Grand Duke Cyril that he was the logical heir to the Romanoff throne.

Losses But Five Votes. Cyril and Dmitri were considered for the honor by the council, but Nicholas received fifty-five of the sixty votes. Alexander Treppoff, who was once premier under the old regime, was elected president of the council. The majority of the Russians in Paris regard the monarchist movement as a lost cause. They say Russia will eventually overthrow the soviets, but will never return to the czarist movement.

To Move Headquarters. The members of the council, however, still believe that the mass of the Russian people would welcome the return to a constitutional monarchy, but they are agreed that nothing can be done but await the will of the Russians in Russia. It was also decided immediately to remove the headquarters of the Russian monarchists' organization from Berlin to Paris. In well informed Russian circles this is said to have been done because of the growing strength of the bolsheviks in Berlin and rumors of close connection with the German government.

91 ON STRANDED SHIP. MIAMI, Fla., November 23.—The steamer Yankton, inbound from Nassau, which ran aground in the ship channel in Biscayne bay yesterday, was still there this morning with little prospect of being floated before night. The vessel was carrying ninety-one passengers and a cargo of freight when she ran ashore.

HAMMER SLAYING CASE MAY BE TRIED AGAIN

Woman, Convicted of Second-Degree Killing, to Seek Review.

LOS ANGELES, November 23.—Mrs. Clara Phillips, convicted a week ago of second-degree murder for beating Mrs. Alberta Tremaine Meadows, twenty-year-old widow, to death with a hammer, was to appear in court today with her chief counsel, Bertram Herrington, to ask for a new trial on technical grounds. "Fatal mistakes were made in the records," Herrington declared, "and they are ample ground for a new trial." A second-degree murder verdict involves a sentence of from ten years to life imprisonment. The district attorney's office made public a letter threatening the defendant with life if she were not sent to the penitentiary.

ACCEPTS TWO RESIGNATIONS. The President has accepted the resignations of Ensign James R. Johnson, attached to the battleship Oklahoma, and of Ensign Francis J. Thomas, attached to the receiving ship at Boston.

CANADIAN TO DEMAND U. S. RETURN WHISKY

One Case and Several Bottles Declared Lost While Ship Held by U. S. Dry Agents.

SEATTLE, Wash., November 23.—The British embassy has been asked to demand of the American government one case of whisky and several additional bottles, alleged to have disappeared from the cargo of the Canadian vessel Half Moon while it was in the custody of the prohibition enforcement agency here, attorney for the owners announced. The Half Moon, disabled, was brought into American waters July 17, by the tanker Saginaw. At Port Angeles, Wash., it was given back to the owners, a cargo of 164 cases of whisky. The whisky was sent here and in due course Attorney General Clegg ordered that it be given back to the owners because the vessel, when disabled, was bound from one British port to another and had not been in American waters. Monday the Half Moon was conveyed from Port Angeles into British waters by a coast guard cutter, with her cargo stored care. The owners alleged there were only 163 cases of whisky and several of these were only one bottle each.
