

CHILDREN'S HABEAS CORPUS PLEA FAILS

Illegal Trial Motion, Based on Lack of King's Permit, Overruled.

ENGLISH URGE CLEMENCY

Free State Supporters Appeal for Release of Miss MacSwiney on Ground of Mercy.

By the Associated Press. DUBLIN, November 23.—A writ of habeas corpus was refused Erskine Childers, lieutenant of Eamonn De Valera, by the master of the rolls today.

To an application by Patrick Lynch, Childers' counsel, for a stay of execution, the judge replied that he could not give it, as he had no jurisdiction. In refusing the writ of habeas corpus the master declared he must take judicial notice of the fact that southern Ireland had been enduring a state of war for months and that it was the duty of the government to maintain its authority, whether provisional or finally constituted, to preserve and save the country from destruction. Force must be met by force.

Own Act to Blame.

Childers had entered the court for protection from the government. The answer must be that the court's jurisdiction was ousted by the act of war, which Childers himself had helped to produce.

The master held that his ruling also applied to the case of prisoners, whose names have not been announced.

The main contention of counsel for Childers yesterday was the denial of all authority by the Irish government, except by consent of King George, which had not been requested in connection with the decree of the government establishing military courts in Ireland. Mr. Conynns, for Childers, insisted that the military were acting under orders of the provisional government. The government was like the king's government.

He argued that no officer of the king could execute a man for the possession of arms. Mr. Conynns invited the master of rolls to take judicial notice of the fact that he now sat under the protection of officers and men of the king's army quartered in Phoenix Park.

Master Denies Charge.

"I am bound to reject the plea that the king here," he declared. "I see the army of the Free State." "The master's power is in the park and the military courts at the gate," replied Mr. Conynns.

The Dublin newspapers yesterday printed an appeal for clemency for Childers, sent by English publicists to the Irish government.

Mrs. MacSwiney enters today on the nineteenth day of her hunger strike. Her sister, Annie, similarly is hunger striking at the same time. Childers took up her vigil last Friday. All day and all night Annie MacSwiney sits there in an armchair propped up by mattresses. She is attended by a few women and girls, who take turns in keeping her company, and there is a nurse on duty.

But on the whole, the fast of neither sister has attracted anything like the public sympathy heretofore accorded to hunger strikers. No news of Mary's condition reaches the outside world, and daily bulletins, so frequent in the past, have given place to silence.

Little Sympathy Shown.

General expressions of sympathy have not been manifest until lately, but now are being expressed by some Free State supporters, are reaching the government, urging Miss MacSwiney's release on the plea of Christian mercy. Daniel Corkery, noted Irish novelist and poet, has issued an eloquent letter in her favor.

Nevertheless, interest in Dublin is not evidenced by crowds outside of Mount Joy, where there are never more than a few sympathizers.

Mrs. MacSwiney's a message sent yesterday to "Ireland's friends in America," expresses appreciation for the many messages of sympathy and for the action taken by the women of the United States against her imprisonment.

"Whether I am released, or whether, like my brother, my sacrifice is to be consummated," Miss MacSwiney's message adds, "I am happy to suffer for Ireland. I would like to thank once more all those who made my stay in America such a happy as well as busy time. I worked for the republic and the republic only, and if some who were our friends then have failed us now, it is hard to blame them, while I remain here, I have proved false, those at home have proved true."

Denouncing the Irish treaty, Miss MacSwiney concludes: "If we have last December over again there would not be ten votes for that treaty."

By the Associated Press. COPENHAGEN, November 23.—The marriage of Princess Dagmar, youngest sister of King Christian, to Lieutenant Joergens Castenskjold was celebrated today. The ceremony was performed in the church at the Castle Fredensborg, one of the summer residences of the Danish kings, by the Very Rev. Dr. Penger, the royal confessionalist. The bride was given away by the Dowager Queen Louise. In conformity with the wishes of the queen, the marriage was strictly private.

The couple will spend their honeymoon trip in Denmark and will eventually settle on Lieut. Castenskjold's modest Jutland estate at Kongstedlund.

At her own request, the bride will be styled Mrs. Castenskjold, retaining the title of princess only in the event of widowhood or divorce. The princess' farewell to spinsterhood was celebrated at the Fredensborg castle last evening with a song festival, in which King Haakon and Crown Prince Olav of Norway, who were among the wedding guests, participated.

NEW EARTH SHOCK REPORTED IN CHILE

Valparaiso Feels Tremor. Relief Supplies Ready for 'Quake Victims.

By the Associated Press. SANTIAGO, November 23.—Reports from Valparaiso state that a slight earthquake occurred in that city at 11:23 o'clock last night.

The distribution of relief supplies brought by the American protected cruisers Cleveland and Denver will be made throughout the area affected by the recent earthquake under the direction of Rear Admiral William C. Cole of the American Navy, it is stated here. The supplies, which were taken from the American naval stores in the Canal Zone, will be divided under the supervision of the Chilean national relief committee.

The relief committee is expected to arrive at Huasco in four or five days. The Denver is four days behind here. Although complete official figures are still lacking, a conservative estimate of the loss of life in the provinces of Coquimbo and Atacama caused by the recent earthquake, is 600 killed and from 1,200 to 1,500 injured, while the material loss to private individuals is about 50,000,000 pesos.

There was no loss of life among American citizens, according to the American embassy, and no American was injured so far as known.

The loss to American firms and citizens is estimated at about 900,000 pesos, Grace & Co.'s Coquimbo office suffering the greatest damage. The Chile Bethlehem Iron Mines Company at Cruz Grande and Las Higueras has a slight loss, while two American families suffered severe losses at Copiapo.

41-POUNDER BY MOTOR.

Huge Bronze Turkey Soon on Way to White House.

Supreme III, a certain forty-one-pound Illinois bronze turkey, is about ready in Chicago to don a black weatherproof coat and hood to protect him from the chilly winds, it was announced here today, and make a motor trip to the White House as a Thanksgiving present from the Harding Girls' Club of Morris & Co., Chicago packers.

The club, formed during the presidential campaign, sent its first turkey to President Harding when he and Mrs. Harding were visiting the Panama canal. Last year Supreme II flew to Washington in a postal airplane, wearing a complete aviator's outfit. This year it is planned to send the bird over the road in record time, 500 miles, without a stop, in a one-ton truck.

BUS LINE TO BE RUN BY CAPITAL TRACTION

Service Will Be Given Between Chevy Chase, Md., and Kensington.

The first venture of the Capital Traction Company into the motor bus field will be made by the establishment of such service between Chevy Chase, Md., and Kensington. It was learned today from John H. Hanna, vice president of the company.

News dispatches from Baltimore state that the Maryland public service commission has approved such a project.

For many months the Capital Traction Company and the Kensington Railway Company have been trying to reach an agreement whereby the former would furnish cars and operate trolley service to the suburban area from Chevy Chase to Kensington.

These efforts have been unsuccessful, however, and the Capital Traction decided to install motor busses to increase transportation facilities in that part of nearby Maryland.

RUMANIANS COMPLETE DEBT MISSION TO U. S.

No Date Has Been Set for Beginning of Payments.

The Rumanian commission which for several weeks has been negotiating with officials of the Treasury and the American debt commission concerning Rumania's war debt to this country yesterday concluded its "preliminary" mission, according to a formal statement from the Treasury Department, and will return to Rumania, leaving "further negotiations to be undertaken at a later date."

The foreign delegation was unable to set the exact date when Rumania can begin paying interest on its debt to the United States. The Rumanians, however, "presented to the funding commission a statement to the effect that it was the intention of the Rumanian government to meet the debt at such time as it should become possible to do so, and received from the funding commission a complete understanding as to the position and desires of the United States government regarding the funding and ultimate payment of the exact powers which the funding commission has for accepting bonds running for not more than twenty-five years for the principal of the debt, the funding of accrued interest, and to such an extent as may be desirable, the funding of future interest."

It was said that negotiations regarding the Rumanian consolidated loan, which has priority in payment upon Rumanian revenues, would be conducted between Rumania and the United States, and to reconcile the Rumanian program with the conditions upon which the American advances were made during the war.


