Walter Moss, 3302 Parnell avenue, found dead in bed today by his wife. Believed to have died of chloroform poisoning, taken following fit of despondency.

Max Present, 26, who escaped from the Kankakee, Ill., insane asylum on Nov. 13, was found on Halsted street and returned to the asylum.

Ernest Weekly, 537 W. 60th street, killed in saving girl from being run down by Wabash train at 59th street. He stumbled and was ground to death under the wheels of same train.

John Cavanaugh, 808 S. State street, died at St. Luke's hospital as result of being struck by street car at Peck place.

Louise Vermilya was held by the coroner's jury, charged with

first-degree murder. She is reported to be dying in the county jail as a result of poison she took before being moved from her home.
