THREE WAYS TO COOK PUMPKIN PIE

Plymouth Pumpkin Pie.—Add beaten yolks of 4 eggs and 1 cupful white sugar to 2 cupfuls pumpkin that has been stewed and put through colander. To mix a quart of milk, 1 teaspoonful cinnamon, mace and nutmeg mixed and whites of eggs, beaten with a good paste, cut slashes in it here and there, stir pumpkin custard well from bottom and put it into pastry. Bake in a steady oven.

Priscilla Pumpkin Pie.—Into quart stewed and strained pumpkin stir quart milk, cup granulated sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg

to taste, and, last of all, the eggs well beaten. Mix thoroughly and pour mixture into deep pie-dish lined with puff paste. Bake in a good oven until custard is "set." Serve cold. Canned pumpkin may be used in same way and is almost good as fresh.

Mt. Holyoke Pumpkin Pie.

One and one-half cups steamed brown sugar, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1-2 teaspoon ginger, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 2 eggs, 1 1-2 cups of milk, 1-2 cup cream. Mix ingredients in order given and bake in 1 crust.
