## War Demagogues Losing Grip.

We are peridically regaled with sanguinary reports that Germany and France or England and Germany are about to grapple in a struggle that would spell disaster to millions.

If the jingo editors and the demagogic politicians had theit way there would be war. But they wont have their way; they are losing their grip on the masses who are expected to kill and maim each other.

The unions and socialist organizations of Germany, France, England, Russia, and other countries have declared against war. They correctly express the opinions of the common people in this respect, and they are doing more to preserve the peace of Europe than all The Hague conferences and Carnegie peace funds ever devised.

## Labor, Turkey's Peace Hope

In the present war betweern Italy and Turkey the latter coumtry has been able to turn nowhere for aid and comfort to end hostilities except the International Socialist bureau at Brussels. President Ahmed Riza, of the Turkish parliament, has appealed to the burean in the name of a common humanity to use its influence to prevent the despoilation and partition of his country, and the socialists are now inaugmrating a general agitation to end
the war and settle all disputes involved by arbitration.

Up to within a year or so labor unions were not tolerated in Turkey. The young Turks were nearly as uncompromisingly opposed to working class organization as was the old regime:
It was the Italian fmmigrants who largely planted the seeds of the new movement of labor and thereby incurred the hatred of the Turkish exploiters. Yet the organized working class of Italy was denounced the war and is demanding peace, and the Italian government fearing that it might be driven from power, has postponed the general parliamentary elections.
