Galena, Ill.—Andrew Perrault, 91, "Son of Revolution," dead. Father fought with Washington when 16.

Buffalo, N. Y.—Ernest Staples, Angola, near here, shot wife and mother-in-law and committed suicide.

Freedom, Pa.—Body of Chas. Rose Royal found in Ohio river, apparently murdered. Coroner's jury ordered arrest of widow.

Los Angeles.—Bert Franklin testified that Job Harriman, Socialist, was present when Darrow gave him money to bribe George Lockwood.

Janesville, Wis.—Charles Crawl, 40, farmer, suicide. Hanged himself. Ill health.

Hocomb, Ill.—Charles Wilkes, killed and mother, Mrs. Charles Schermerhorn and 2 friends seriously injured. Auto turned turtle.

Washington.—Borah 8-hour bill for workmen on government contracts passed senate, 45 to 11.

Washington.—Nomination of former Gov. Richard E. Sloan, Arizona, as federal judge in that state, before senate. Progressives to fight it.

Springfield, Ill.—Raymond McClelland, 20, of this city, arrested in Kansas City for forgery, was recently paroled from Kankakee asylum.

Omaha, Neb.—Victor Rosewater, chairman Republican Nation Committee, said Nebraska delegation didn't ask for tickets to Chicago convention.

Washington.—Rep. Steener-son, Minn., lauded Roosevelt for changing mind about reciprocity. Called Democrats foolish for following Taft's lead.

Washington.—Ex-Forester Clifford Pinchot and Delegate Wickersham before Senate Territories Committee pleaded for self-government in Alaska.

Leadville, Colo.—Leadville and Lake county suffering heaviest snowstorm of season. 11 inches of snow fallen by noon.

Dayton, O.—Body of Wilbur Wright in state from 9 a.m. until noon today. Services at 3 p. m. Trains halted for 5 minutes during funeral.

New York.—2,500 waiters from 21 hotels, 6 restaurants and 2 clubs out. Managers won't recognize union. College boy strike-breakers a failure.

Sioux City, Ia.—Armour and Cudahy packing plants have granted 500 striking laborers 19 cents an hour. Men back at work.

New York.—Paul Benjamin, theatrical man, died in Liverpool. Pneumonia. Family in Milwaukee.

San Francisco.—4 dynamite explosions within hour in downtown district. Saloon and pool-room wrecked.

London.—Posters urging Irish rebellion covered billboards in Wexford, Ireland. Police removed them.

Baltimore.—Everything is in readiness for Democratic convention. Sub-committee on arrangements will meet here June 10.
