Thaw has announced that if it is not he will demand another hearing next year, and one every year until he is set at liberty. His mother, despite the drain of the trials and hearings, still has a huge fortune and it is at Harry's disposal.

The state paid its alienists \$12,000 for their evidence at the last hearing. Jerome, again on the job to keep Thaw behind bars, is said to have received \$10,000.

In this hearing 775,000 words of testimony were taken, making 3,500 typewritten pages.

What's the surest way to keep mice out of closed drawers?—Ann.—If camphor be kept in drawers and cupboards their contents will be safe from mice. They detest the smell.

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What's the quickest way to take the burning sensation out of a bad burn?—Inquirer.—Dry flour is one of the simplest and most accessible as a rule. Cover the burn thickly and there will be a partial cessation of the pain at once. It simply excludes the air from the raw cuticle. For children's burns mix baking soda with enough lard to make a salve, or cold water and soda.

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Irma asks: What will promote the growth of the eye brows and lashes and absolutely prevent them from falling out?—Glycerine rubbed into the eyebrows each night before you retire will add to the growth. Clipping just a shave off the lashes every month is recommended sometimes as a means of making them grow longer. But if I were you I should much prefer to let my eyelashes remain as nature made them.
