WILL PROBE KILLING

Jackson, Mich., Sept. 14.—An investigation is being made into the murder of John Eissy, an Assyrian, by soldiers patrolling the walls of Jackson penitentiary.

Eissy was janitor of St. Mary's church. His home was only a short distance from the prison. It is believed he wandered near the prison walls and was ordered to tell his business. When he became frightened and ran the soldiers fired on him.

Captain Blacklen, in command of the soldiers at the pen, refuses to say how the killing occurred or who fired the shot that killed Eissy.
