Piedmont, W. Va., July 1.—A modern Laocoon has matched the horrible experience of his aucient prototype, but escaped with his life through sheer courage and presence of mind.

He is George Ensor, a business man of this city, who is slowly recovering from many snake bites, bruises and burns and the nervous
