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## WOMAN IS KNOWN AS "JOAN OF ARC OF NEW YORK CHURCH RAIDERS"

*Says Unemployed Took Churches at Their Word—  
"Come Unto Me, All Ye Who Are Weary and  
Heavy Laden, and I Will Give You Rest."*

Jane Rolston, mother of the great army of New York unemployed!

Yesterday nobody outside a small circle of radicals had ever heard of her. Today she is known as the "Joan of Arc of the church raiders" who for weeks have been the sensation of New York city.

Miss Rolston, who was once a student at Wellesley College, teaches Latin and mathematics for a living, but she gives all her leisure to her work as secretary of Local 179 of the I. W. W. Born in Maine, she was for 20 years a teacher in California and

numbered Jack London and Anna Strunsky among her friends. She has been identified as the fiery heroine called the Red Virgin in London's novel, "The Iron Heel," which foretells a great industrial revolution in 1918.

But Miss Rolston repudiates this identification and says that the next time she meets London she is "going to pull Jack's hair" for letting such an impression get about.

To this middle-aged teacher the homeless, desperate men numbered among the New York church raiders
