STATE FEARS OWN WITNESSES IN TRIAL OF HEARST SLUGGERS

*Only Two State's Witnesses Who Testified Before Grand
Jury Will Be Used at Trial of Barrett Bros. and
Friedman—One Witness Works for Hearst.*

Only two witnesses who testified for the state before the grand jury will be used during the trial of Ed and Charley Barrett and Arthur Friedman, Hearst sluggers, who are charged with the murder of Conductor Frank Witt. They are Henry Grosskurth and Dr. Joseph Springer. The state is afraid to take any others following the discovery that one of the witnesses, Francis Burns, who was regarded as one of the most reliable state witnesses, is now working in the circulation department of the Chicago Examiner.

All witnesses appeared for the

state before the grand jury. They were Frank Goodon, a machinist; Henry Grosskurth, William Enz, Ben Feldman, Dr. Joseph Springer and Edward Thielepape.

Of these Benny Feldman and Frank Goodon are missing. Henry Grosskurth, who was reported missing yesterday came to the Day Book office this morning and made the following statement:
