*"How Much Will You Bid for My Spine?" Is Her Query
—Wants To Sell Her Backbone To Bring Health
and Happiness To Crippled Sisters.*

Philadelphia, Pa., April 11.—To restore her two half-sisters to health and so enable them to earn their own livings, Mrs. Alberta R. Kenner of Meadowbrook, a suburb of Philadelphia, has offered her own spine for sale to the highest bidder!

Mrs. Kenner believes doctors or hospitals interested in the progress of medical science will pay almost any amount for the reversion, after death, of her spinal cord, because of its extraordinary and unique qualities.

For twenty-seven years a helpless invalid from locomotor ataxia, this

heroic wife does all her own work on the farm where she lives with her husband and daughter, operates a typewriter and a sewing machine, and when I called on her today to hear the remarkable story of sacrifice and devotion she had just finished a day's ironing!

"For twenty-seven years I was absolutely helpless from a diseased spine," Mrs. Kenner said. "My two half-sisters, Cora and Gladys, were also victims in their childhood of paralysis. This left Gladys, who is now twelve, with a crippled arm, and still
